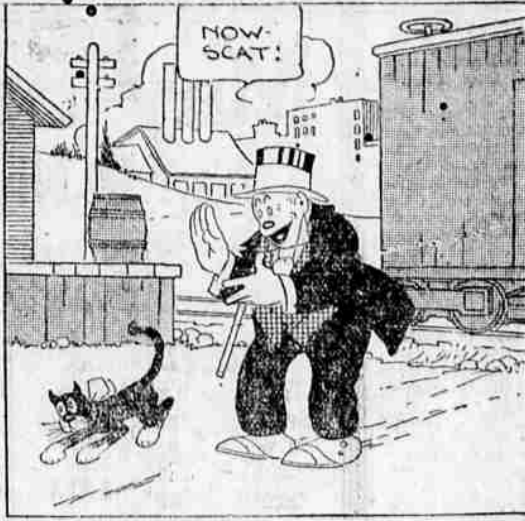

EXPERT CABLEMEN RUSHED TO CITY TO REPAIR LINES

The sudden storm which struck the city Wednesday evening played havoc with telephone service in Medford and vicinity. The Home Telephone and Telegraph company had their underground plant in the course of overhauling and the sudden rush of the waters got in many of the underground cables putting many lines out of service. The construction crew of Foreman Hines was placed on the job restoring service and Manager Hammond called Portland for immediate relief. Although Portland has just experienced a fire which put thousands of telephones out of service, expert cablemen left there last night and arrived in Medford this morning. These men went to work at once and with the assistance of Foreman Hines and his crew are fast putting the phones back in service. Day and night crews will be on the job and Manager Hammond expects all the trouble to be cleared by Monday night.
