

HEAVY FIGHTING ALONG FRONT IN MOROCCAN WAR

FEZ, French Morocco, May 22.—Severe fighting has continued all day on portions of the front where French soldiers are opposing the tribesmen of Abd-El-Krim who have invaded the French zone, an official communique stated.

French successes were indicated.

PARIS, May 22.—(By Associated Press.) Both the French and their Riffian enemies in Morocco are preparing for the big struggle which seems inevitable. The situation on the French side is described as satisfactory.

General Count DeChambre's campaign in the central sector with the object of relieving the besieged outposts on the other side of the Ouerghia river is progressing notwithstanding the determined resistance of the Riffians. The work of strengthening the front in the region of Illane continues.

On the eastern wing in the Kifan region, reports continue to come in of strong concentrations of Riffians with artillery.

LeMatin's Madrid correspondent says that the talks between M. Malvy, representing the French government and General Primo de Rivera, head of the Spanish military directors, resulted in an agreement on the Moroccan problem which leaves each nation free for the realization of its plans.

SECY. OF STATE TO CALL EMERGENCY FINANCE MEETING

SALEM, Ore., May 22.—Some time early in June Secretary of State Koser expects to call a meeting of the state emergency board for the emergency appropriation of money for various purposes and necessitated by failure of the legislature to add appropriating clauses in several acts requiring the expenditure of money.

Chief of these will be the act requiring all owners of motor vehicles to file with the state articles of ownership relative to their vehicles, accounting, among other things for all items that may be held against the cars.

This act, becoming effective July 1, will necessitate practically a new department in the secretary of state's office, with a clerical force to mail out to the nearly 200,000 motor vehicle owners the blanks that they must fill out and to register and file the certificates when they are returned to the department. It is estimated conservatively that the act will require an expenditure of \$50,000 a year and perhaps far in excess of that the first year. No appropriation was made nor provision as to what fund shall be drawn upon for the expense of administration. The bill was sponsored by the state motor association and is designed, among other things, to facilitate the recovery of cars stolen or otherwise unlawfully taken.

BIG LIQUOR SEIZURE MADE ON N. Y. SHIP

NEW YORK, May 22.—Ale and whiskey valued at more than \$150,000 were seized by customs agents this afternoon on the steamship Boston of the Eastern Steamship company's line and the freighter Winter. Customs officials said it was the biggest seizure ever made from coastwise vessels.

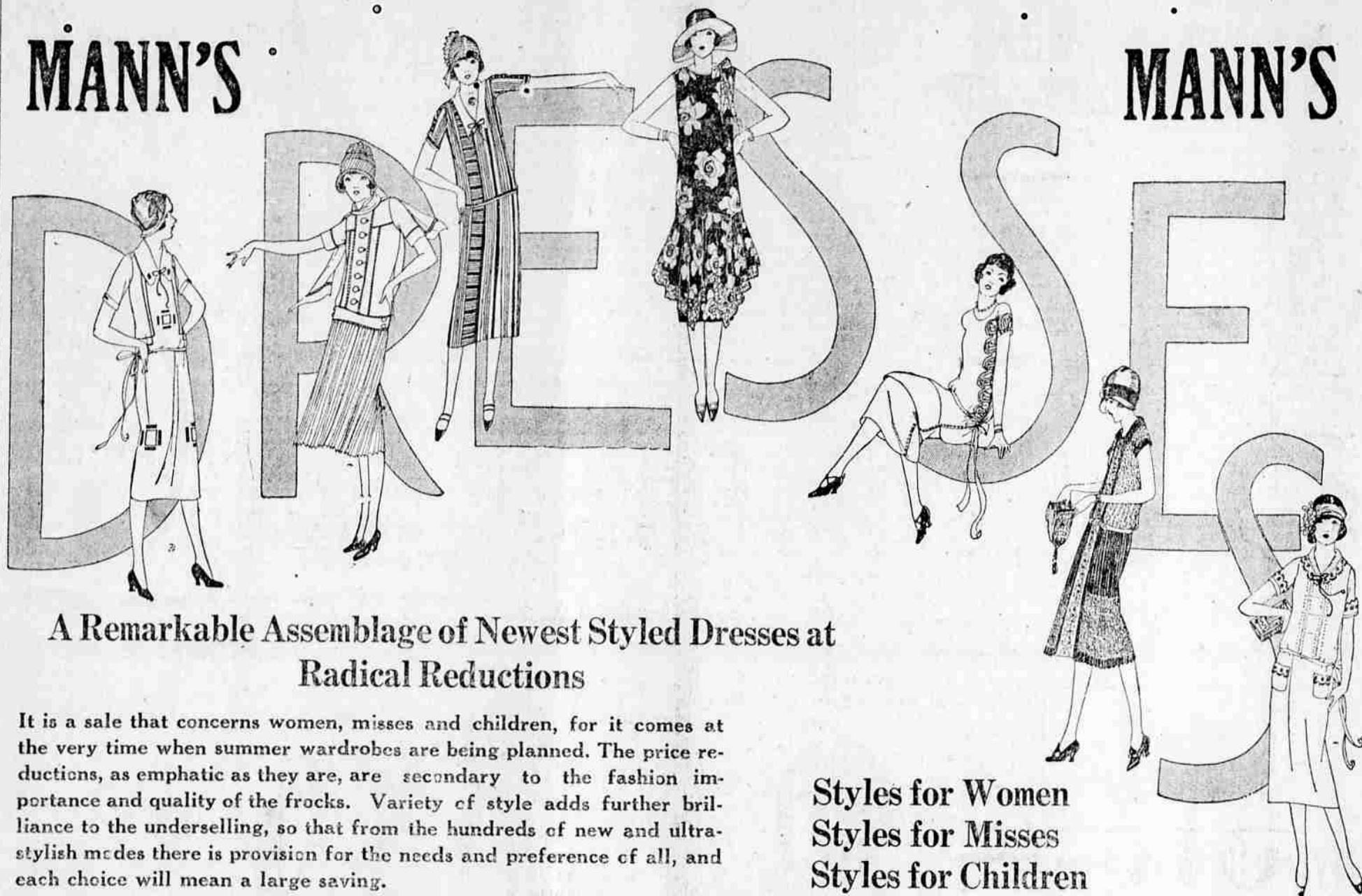
The "Daily" Bank Robbery
