MINING NEWS OF SOUTHWESTERN OREGON

North Pole Mine Again Under Operation.
The North Pole mine of Rogue River changed hands this week, having been leased to Steiner and Neldhart. California miners of considerable experience and with sound financial backing. This will be good news to those who are interested in the proper development of the real mines of the county, of which this is one, of the friends of P. H. Robinson, through whose efforts the mine was originally opened, brought into the market, and finally sold.
The history of the North Pole is typical of some of the best mines of this county and worth recounting. Mr. Robinson, a miner of long experience, made the original discovery and location, the property finally covering six claims. He had the usual difficulties with claim jumpers and paper hangers, but having finally perfected his title, proceeded in a miner-like fashion to develop his prospect to a point where it was suitable. To this end he drove a tunnel by hand work to the ore body, erected on the claim a two-stamp mill and ran through it some five hundred tons of ore, making so high a recovery on the plates that the value of the property was proven beyond question. The mine reached this point, however, at a time when it was exceedingly hard to move any mine property and he, therefore, incorporated both for the purpose of securing additional, and of interesting others in marketing the property. Mr. Robinson, however, being locally favorably known, and a practical man, secured as his first lessee, parties from Portland from whom great things were expected. Some two years ago under this lease the two stamp mill was replaced by a five stamp mill, and great hopes were entertained that the mine was about to be proved up for what reports indicated it to be. The tenure of the lessee resulted in an impractical, poorly managed affair, resulting in leaving the mine in a worse condition than it was when taken over.
This condition of affairs so unsatisfactory to everybody interested in the general development, and so expensive to the owners and everyone connected with it, and but for the persistence of Mr. Robinson himself, might have continued indefinitely. However, with characteristic energy, succeeded in bringing the property to the attention of the present lessees who plan to do the property the long delayed justice it merits. This will, of necessity, take some time to establish, but the result of its accomplishment will undoubtedly give great satisfaction to all concerned.
It is one of the unaccountable peculiarities of the industry in southwestern Oregon that a mine practically on the highway within 20 minutes' drive from the city of Grants Pass, ideally located and with a large body of proved ore in sight should attract so little attention from local people. For such a mine to be found in any neighboring state, capital would seek it and its presence would cause a veritable stampede, whereas here, except among the miners, themselves, its presence is scarcely noticed. A few more men of Mr. Robinson's stamp, who work faithfully to promote legitimate mining would be a good thing for the country. Mines opening, up, mark advances in the industry, and those who help, whether promoter, prospector or operator, deserve a great deal of credit.

Local Mining News

GRANTS PASS, May 23.—(Special)—L. H. Van Horn was in town this week on business. Mr. Van Horn has charge of the work of opening up and driving tunnels on the property that is operating in the city of Gold Hill.
P. C. Butler was in from the Horseshoe mine on Coyote Creek with samples of ore running as high as \$25,000 to the ton. Mr. Butler plans a complete minerlike development of the property.
L. L. Stenger came in from Canyonville with samples of a recent lode encountered in which a 14-foot drift has not yet reached the further wall. The ore appears to be almost identical with that found in the Cripple creek district.
Work on the Cohn ledge, with Mr. Coates in charge, is to continue to progress. They have just completed a hundred foot drift and are contemplating an extension of the same distance. The development of this mine will bring back one of the oldest producers in the county.
George M. Esterly is on a trip to Portland on business. The work at the Llano del Oro is going on very satisfactorily, moving about between five and seven thousand yards a day.
H. M. Willoughby, one of the lessees of the Leap Gravel Mine was in town this week, and reports excellent progress along the line laid down by the resident engineer in charge. Mr. Willoughby is a very successful business man from Coos Bay, and is working out his mining problems according to conservative business methods. Under those circumstances, with a property like the Deep Gravel it is impossible for his venture to be other than profitable.
Dues for the coming year of the Mining Bureau are now payable. We are having some expense for the annual meeting and the registry of mines, and the only method of meeting this is through the membership dues of those interested in mining.
Remember the date of the annual meeting. We are going to have a big time, and an excellent program. Hon. W. C. Hawley, representative in congress, Dean Newton, of the O. A. C. school of mines and Hon. E. W. Miller of the state legislature, are scheduled to speak. An interesting, as well as educational feature of the day will be the inspection of the metals extraction plant, where the recovery of gold and platinum is made by what is called the Crozer process. There will be other features for the day, so all miners, and all interested in mining are urged to be in attendance.
