SALEM, Ore., May 26.—The following opinions were handed down today by the supreme court: Caroline Ordeman vs. C. Earl Watkins, appellant; appeal from Multnomah county; suit to collect damages for personal injury. Opinion by Jus-

tee Rand. Judge Robert G. Morrow affirmed. In the matter of the determination of relative water rights of Willow creek and tributaries, a tributary of the Malheur river. Willow River Water Users association, appellants, Emery Cole, cross-appellant, W. H. Eaton, et al cross appellants, vs. Grehards Water company, et al; ap-

peal from Malheur county. Opinion by Justice Coshov. Motion to dismiss denied and decree of Judge Dalton Biggs affirmed. P. R. 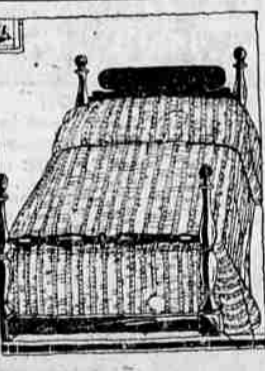
