COURT REFUSES TO DECIDE ARGUMENT TWIXT GRAPPLERS

CHICAGO, May 27.—(A. P.)—The place to determine a championship is in the ring and not in the courts.

This, in effect, was the decision of Judge Hugo Friend, who refused yesterday to grant an injunction sought by Stanislaus Zyzsko, restraining promoters from advertising the match between Ed "Strangler" Lewis and Wayne "Big" Munn at Michigan City, Saturday afternoon as a championship affair.

There is no precedent for such action," he judge said, "and if the court were to attempt to decide who is champion in this case, every athlete who deemed himself aggrieved, in an athletic contest would be rushing into court for relief."

Zyzsko stated in his plea that Munn had won the title from Lewis and that he, Zyzsko, had won the championship from Munn in a recent Philadelphia encounter. Zyzsko's attorneys tried to establish the fact that custom always had determined a champion in wrestling. It had always been up to the forerunners to determine a winner of a mat bout, but Walter Bates, who acted as referee of the match discussed Lewis-Munn mat at Kansas City last January, testified as a witness for the defendant that he had never declared a winner of the go in which Munn tossed the Strangler out of the ring.
