

HAY SHED BLOWN DOWN IN TABLE ROCK DISTRICT

TABLE ROCK, Ore., May 29.—Several of our farmers commenced cutting the first crop of alfalfa this week. The large hay shed on the Dunlap ranch was blown down during the storm of May 19, which was quite severe but only of a few minutes' duration.

The many friends of G. P. Hall in this vicinity were sorry to hear of the death of his wife, Mrs. Stacy Hall, at Oakland, Cal., on May 4. The Hall family were former residents of this district and have many friends here who deeply sympathize with them at this time.
