

READY RESPONSE TO FINANCIAL DRIVE ASHLAND C. OF C

Ashland, June 5.—Much satisfaction is expressed in the liberal and ready response by the business men in the present drive for the Chamber of Commerce budget. Forty-eight subscribers have already pledged a total of \$1,325 with every prospect of a largely augmented total by night. The goal set is \$4,200 and there is every reason to believe that there will not be the least difficulty in securing subscriptions for the requisite amount.
