JOHNNY DUNDEE TO TEMPT FATE IN RING TONIGHT

NEW YORK, June 9.—(A. P.)—Another of pugilism's veterans, two of whom have already gone down to defeat in the opening outdoor boxing shows of the season, will enter the ring tonight to fight a double battle against ambitious youth and father time.

Johnny Dundee is the third battle scarred warrior to hurt his back on the fate of Mike McGuire and Tommy Gibbons, the former featherweight champion will make his stand this evening at the inaugural show of the new Coney Island stadium in a fifteen-round fight with Sid Terris, New York lightweight, who only recently won a close verdict from him in the final contest in Madison Square Garden.

'MAC' SMITH AND JOE KIRKWOOD TO REPRESENT U. S. A.

NEW YORK, June 9.—(A. P.)—America's hopes of winning the British open golf championship this year travel down the bay and out to sea today on the Lusitania which sails with MacDonald Smith and Joe Kirkwood on her passenger list. The Lakeville professional and the trick shot artist constitute America's sole entry in the British event.

Walter Hagen, last year's winner, has declined to defend his title, but in Mac Smith, this country sends a winner of the California and the North and South open events, as well as the leader of the Eastern open qualification test at Lido. The British open will be staged this year at Prestwick on June 22, 23, 25 and 26.

ATHLETICS' LEAD REDUCED AGAIN

NEW YORK, June 9.—The leading Philadelphia Athletics today viewed with new alarm the reduction of their advantage over the champion Senators in the American league to but a game and a half. Little hope of recovery of the team from a slump is entertained, until its weakened pitching staff is bolstered by the return to regular duty of Sam Gray and Fred Heimach, both of whom are injured.

Washington picked up another half game on Mack's team yesterday by remaining idle while the pace-makers were being jolted again in Detroit, where the Tigers pulled out a 7 to 6 triumph after the Athletics had tied the score in their half of the ninth.

YACHT RACE TO TAHITI TO START TOMORROW P. M.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9.—Four San Francisco yachts provisioned for a three weeks' run are at anchor off Sausalito awaiting the starting gun to speed them on what is considered to be the longest yacht race ever promoted. From the Golden Gate to Tahiti—a distance of 3665 miles, the little craft will contest with each other, straining every mile of the way to win the Lipton trophy that

awaits the boat making the best time, handicaps to be considered. A second cup from the San Francisco yacht club will go to the first boat to anchor in Tahiti harbor regardless of handicaps.

The personnel of the racing committee will be named today. The starting gun will boom at 4:30 tomorrow afternoon. Yachts which will start will be the Mariner, owned by L. A. Norris; Eloise, John C. Piver; Idalia, Dr. E. K. Parker, and the Shawnee, belonging to Mark Fontana.

Stecher to Meet Koloff. LOS ANGELES, June 9.—Joe Stecher, world's heavyweight wrestling champion, was here today, ready to defend his recently acquired title tomorrow night against Dan Koloff. The match will be held at the exposition park armory.

AUTO RACES HERE SANCTIONED BY A. A. A.

Big preparations are being made for the auto races at the fair grounds Saturday and Sunday, June 13 and 14 and inquiries are coming in by wire and mail to the secretary, Sid Brown, regarding purses and conditions.

Fast cars and experienced drivers are expected from Seattle and Vancouver, Washington and cities in Oregon outside of Jackson county, as well as a number of fast ones from this county. The races are sanctioned by the American Automobile Association, which means they will be conducted

in an efficient and desirable way. There will be four auto races each afternoon and also motorcycle races. Gates open at 12:30; races start at 2:30 p. m.

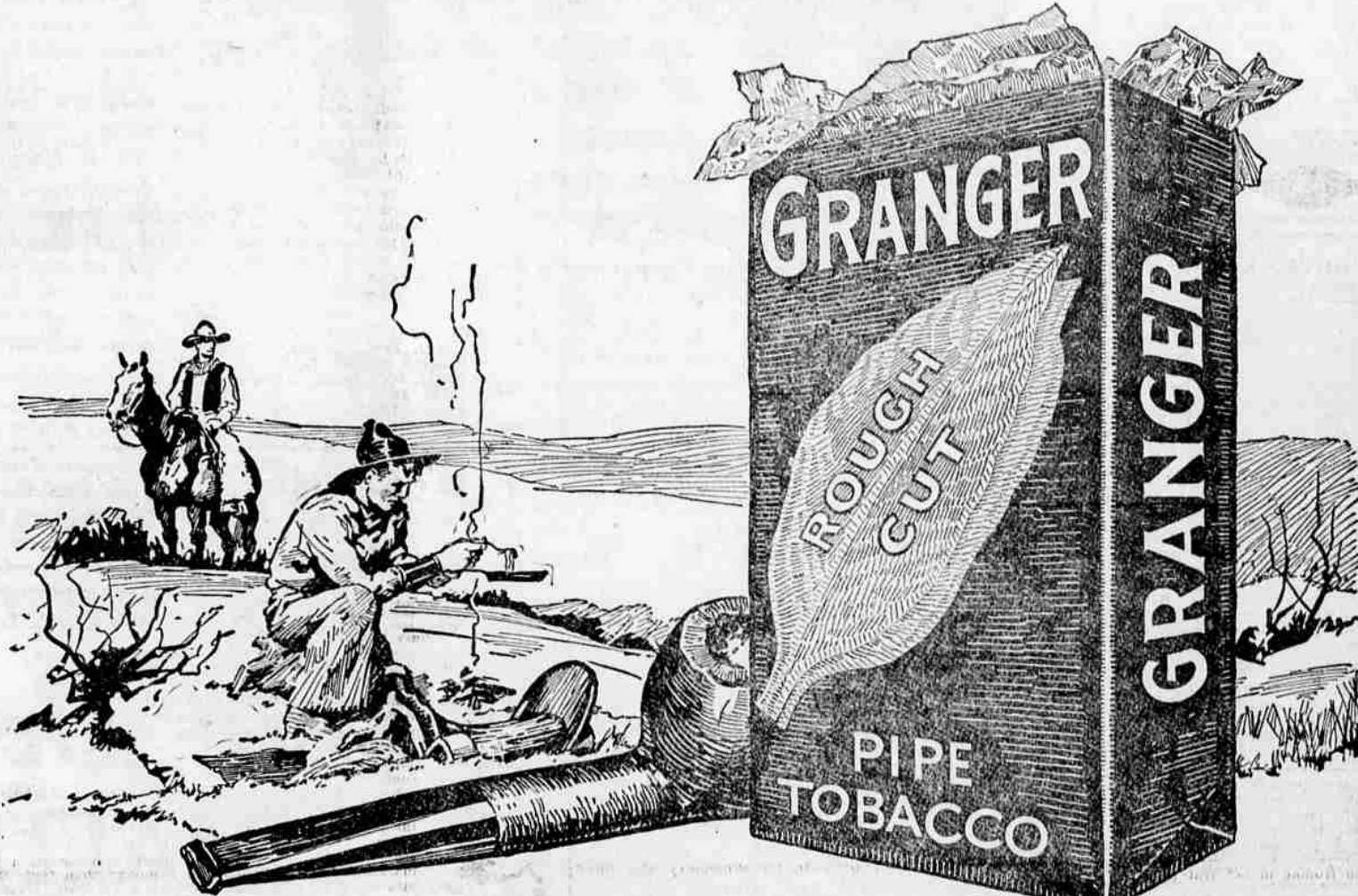
Americans Are Given Control Soviet Mines
