EDITOR PREDICTS TRIP TO MOON ON SKYROCKET SOON

BOULDER, Colo., June 10.—(A. P.)—Human transportation to the moon by means of huge rockets may be a possibility in a few years, so rapid are the present day strides in science—in the opinion of Dr. Watson Davis, managing editor of "Science Service."
"I am confident that in a few years a rocket will be perfected for making a trip to la Jules Verne, from the earth to the moon," declared Dr. Davis in an address before the 18th annual convention of the American Society for the Advancement of Science here.
"A model of such a rocket is now under construction," he said.
Dr. Davis also foresees the day when science will make possible the transformation of idiots into citizens through scientific treatment of the glands, and an era in which millions will be fed from synthetic food of oil shale.
