PORTLAND MILLERS REDUCE PRICE OF FLOUR 40 CENTS

PORTLAND, Ore., July 3.—Not a single cup of oatmeal was available for the local flour trade today, says the Telegram. One car in yesterday was spotted long enough to take out less than 100 crates and then was sealed up again to be shipped to a higher market. In the face of the temporary shortage in this market local produce firms are holding prices firm at \$5.25 and \$5.50 for the best standards. This morning there were hardly enough good quality melons to meet requirements and several houses ran short of standards during the morning. That the situation will be easier during the coming week is the general belief along the street. Good tomatoes are very scarce with best stocks re-packed selling readily at \$3 a crate. Soft over-ripe stock is selling at \$2 1/2 up.

MRS. COOLIDGE HAS A NARROW ESCAPE

SWAMPSCOTT, Mass., July 3.—(A. P.) Mrs. Coolidge barely escaped being run down by a motorcycle this morning during a walk about Swampscott, a leap to the side of the road saving her. She was returning to White Court and had just turned into the private driveway when four members of the state constabulary on motorcycles turned into the lane behind her. Driving at a fast clip, according to witnesses, the motorcycle officers were behind her almost before anyone was aware. The grinding of brakes and a yell by James Haley, her secret service man gave Mrs. Coolidge her only warning and as she jumped to one side of the road the leading machine shot between her and Haley. The motorcycle detachment which was coming to White Court to escort the president to Cambridge, proceeded to the summer White House without stopping.
