WHEAT PRODUCERS COMBINE ON ROCKS ISSUE S. O. S. CALL

CHICAGO, July 6.—(A. P.) Officers of the Grain Marketing company, the \$20,000,000 corporation launched a year ago to facilitate the merger of four mid-western grain firms in a project designed eventually to command producer control, announced today the rock selling campaign among farmers had been definitely abandoned.
John W. Coverdale, secretary-treasurer of the company, said the promotion work of the holding organization had not been pushed as vigorously as originally planned for the last thirty days and that the firm must find other means of meeting \$4,000,000 in obligations falling due July 28.
Officers and directors of the company assembled today for a special meeting to consider the future course of the enterprise.
An advance of \$4,000,000 for operating expenses made by the merging of the firms must be repaid by July 25 under the original contract terms. Officers of the company are working on other plans to meet the obligation but prior to the meeting none would discuss the proposal in hand.

PARIS COMMISSION TO BE NAMED TONIGHT

PARIS, July 6.—(A. P.) The cabinet probably will name this evening the commission to be sent to Washington to discuss funding the French war debt.
Among those thought likely to be included are: M. Poincaré, chairman of the foreign affairs committee of the chamber of deputies and Deputies Henri Auriol and Daniel Vincent of the left groups and active in the financial questions of the chamber.
It is said the entire commission will be composed of members of parliament, with some experts from the finance ministry attached. Finance Minister Caillaux may not be included in the mission, but may be sent to Washington as a special envoy.

ELLSWORTH MOURNS FOR FATHER INSTEAD OF ATTENDING DINNER

OSLO, Norway, July 6.—(A. P.) Lincoln Ellsworth of New York, co-leader with Captain Adm. Amundsen of the recent north polar aerial expedition plans to start for America about July 22. Amundsen, Ellsworth and the other members of their party landed here yesterday and received a magnificent reception.
Mr. Ellsworth explained today that he did not attend last night's banquet in honor of the explorers at the royal palace because funeral services were being held at Cleveland for his father, James W. Ellsworth, who died near Florence, Italy, June 3, when the fate of the Amundsen-Ellsworth party was unknown.
Captain Amundsen desires Mr. Ellsworth to join him for a rest at Amundsen's home at Bundefjord near Oslo, but the American prefers to put in a couple of weeks mountain-climbing in Norway before sailing for home.
