

ASHLAND C. OF C. SECRETARY TALKS ON COMMUNITY

EUGENE, Ore., July 10.—Today the last day of the fifth annual short course for commercial secretaries at the University of Oregon, which closes with a banquet and dance in the woman's building tonight.

C. E. Wilson, Salem, will open the session this morning with his discussion on "getting your activities into print." Following this "Oregon, a national playground," will be the topic of Professor O. F. Stafford, head of the University of Oregon department of chemistry, for a short lecture.

During the afternoon session J. H. Fuller of Ashland will lead the discussion of "characteristics of the Oregon community," followed by "the question box," under the leadership of Earl Murray of Marshfield.

E. C. Simmons of Eugene, outlined the "aviation in Oregon," at the assembly held yesterday.

"The Pacific coast must have more municipal landing fields with accompanying emergency landing field before air mail service can be successfully adopted," he declared. He predicted that tourist travel in the future will be almost entirely by air and that in five years he expects aviation to be nearly as common as automobile.

"Planes today can be operated as cheaply as automobiles and are as easy to manipulate," he said. The airplane is fast developing into a commercial machine and the present lack of landing fields is a serious handicap to a more rapid development, he pointed out.

Financing the state chamber of commerce was considered during the session. Plans for the various methods of gaining financial aid for the project were discussed by the members under the leadership of W. G. Mc, president of the state chamber who asked the secretaries for support in maintaining the idea. The idea of co-operation between the local and state chambers was discussed. A decision will be reached today on the question, it was said.

26 CHILDREN OF PRE-SCHOOL AGE AT GOLD H. CLINIC

Twenty-six pre-school age children attended the child welfare conference held at Gold Hill on Tuesday afternoon by the Jackson County Health Unit in co-operation with the Jackson County Health association. The conference was held for the children of the Gold Hill and Sams Valley districts. Examination included weighing and measuring, dental, eye, ear, nose, throat, heart, lungs and body examination. This conference was in charge of Miss Irene Mann, public health nurse.

Dr. V. S. Geary, county health officer, examined the babies assisted by Miss Irene Mann and Miss Vera Beard public health nurses and Miss Josephine Coppes, office secretary.

Women of the Gold Hill committee of the Public Health association assisted with the records.

Child welfare panels, telling the proper care of children, were on display. These panels were loaned by the Medford chapter of American Red Cross. Literature was furnished by the Metropolitan Life Insurance company and the United States department of labor.

The next child welfare conference is in Ashland Friday, July 16.

ATHRACITE MINERS REFUSE ARBITRATION

The miners' sub-committee of six reached this decision at a morning meeting in advance of the opening of actual conferences this afternoon.

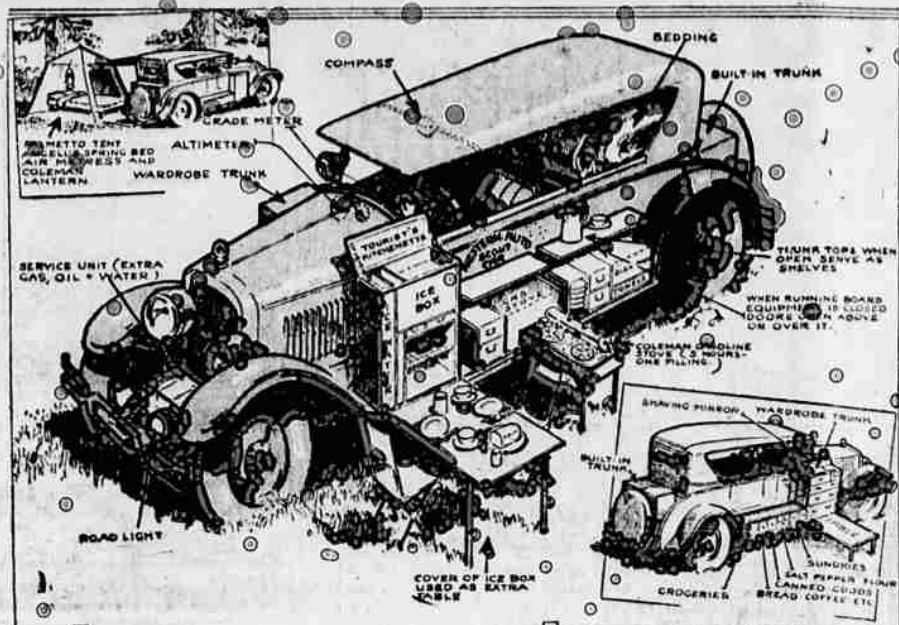

Comforts of Home in Car



"Outdoor" Franklin, well known road scout and camping informant for the Western Auto Supply Company, will arrive here Saturday, July 11 and will establish his headquarters while here at the local branch of the Western Auto Supply Company, located at Riverside and East Main Street, and will remain until the 12th. Franklin is recognized authority on camping in the west and he is passing on his experiences to all interested persons who care to call on him.

The car is claimed to be the best equipped scout car in the country. Beginning at the front, the equipment starts with a heavy duty bumper. Be-

tween the two guards, just behind the bumper rests a service unit for emergency use, a set of three containers for gasoline, oil and water. A tourist kitchenette on the left running board provides an ice box, a large container for ice water, a space for fresh meats and vegetables, and a safe carrier for milk and eggs. The side cover of the kitchenette lets down, and can be used as an extra table. On the same side is a gasoline stove, aluminum nesting set of dishes and cooking equipment.

The back of the car carries a heavy bumper, two extra tires and a just-proof wardrobe trunk.

The right-hand running board carries special built trunks and equipment for clothing, camera and films, groceries, folding furniture and a lantern. The trunks on both sides close down so they do not block the door to either the front seat.

In the tonneau of the car is a palm-etto tent, spring folding bed, and air mattress. The bedding is carried on the seat.

A pair of spotlights are attached to the windshield to insure safe driving at night. A goniometer and altimeter is included on the dashboard equipment. Above the driver's head fastened to the top bow, a compass is installed to guide him on his travels.
