# CUT-WORM INVASION OF GARDENS CLAIMED

An early morning tour of the valley south of Phoenix, made by a representative of the Monarch Seed & Feed company, discloses a serious invasion of the destructive army worm, commonly termed cutworms. In great numbers, like an army, devastating as they go. Like the grasshoppers, they attack practically all kinds of plants, including field and truck crops, vineyards and orchards, as well as flowers and weeds. In this particular case the worms are confining their activities to ground crops. Much damage has been done in the Talent district and with a northward movement of the worms damage must be anticipated in fields that lay in their pathway, unless the insects are controlled.

# Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, July 10.—The closing was heavy. Spirited bidding for Rock Island common, which was bid up nearly three points to above 47 checked the decline in the late trading, but not until after United States East Iron Pipe had been driven down eight points and Universal Pipe and United Cigar Stores about two each. Isolated points of strength developed in today's stock market, but the main price tendency was downward. Profit taking and bear selling were inspired by the temporary stiffening of money rates, a disappointing United States steel tonnage report and failure of the oils to respond to an increase in mid-continent crude prices. Dodge Brothers common crossed 29 to a new high. Total sales approximated 1,150,000 shares.

# JUDGE M'BRIDE RULES ON TOBACCO BALLOT

SALEM, Ore., July 10.—Chief Justice McBride of the supreme court yesterday issued an alternative writ of review in an original proceeding filed for the purpose of getting a change made in the ballot title of the tobacco tax referendum bill. It is the case of the state on relation of John H. Carson, district attorney for Marion county, against Secretary of State Koser and the Oregon Retail Tobacco Dealers' association. The case is an appeal from the lower court, where Judge McMahan dismissed the case on grounds that the wrong procedure was being followed by the plaintiffs. The petitioners aver that the ballot title is unfair in that it does not properly describe the act.
