

STATE LAND BD. UPHeld BY TAX LAW DECISION

SALEM, Ore., July 14.—Cooks county must accept tax without penalty interest and costs on certain lands in that county on which the state land board holds mortgages, covering the years 1921, 1922 and 1923, according to an opinion by the supreme court today. The opinion by Chief Justice McCall grants a writ of mandamus ordered by the land board in an original proceeding and it holds as mandatory and discoverable with certain exceptions by the legislature, authorizing the remission of penalties, interest and costs in these delinquent taxes. The opinion also nullifies the state constitutional provision that the state treasury be funded in the case of taxes not known, but it is of statewide importance, applying to all counties where similar conditions exist.

Oregon Supreme Court Decisions

Judge James A. Eakin affirmed. P. B. Sears, et al. appellants, vs. Orchard Water company; appeal from Malheur county; objection to cost bill of defendants based on opinion of May 22 affirming decree of lower court; objection overruled by the court. State of Oregon ex rel state land board, et al. petitioners, vs. Cook county; original proceedings in mandamus to compel remission of penalty and interest on delinquent taxes. GOVERNMENT TO KEEP CLOSER TAB ON U. S. BREWERY

WASHINGTON, July 14.—(A. P.)—Two major campaigns are holding the attention of prohibition enforcement officials who are taking the offensive in one and a defensive stand in the other. While treasury and department of justice branches concerned with prohibition are planning to dry up a high power beer sources an avalanche of political pressure for appointments in the new enforcement machine has appeared. Assistant Secretary Andrews of the treasury, and Mrs. Isabel Willbrandt, chief attorney general, have devised a new inventory formula system and have arranged for closer cooperation between their departments for more rapid prosecution of violators. Every "potential brewery" will be watched to determine whether beer of more than the legal alcoholic content is removed from them. Under the reorganization the state prohibition directors are to be appointed by regional directors and these few positions, paying up to \$7,200 have brought forth several contests.

JIMMY GOODRICH NEW LIGHTWEIGHT CHAMPOIN U. S. A.

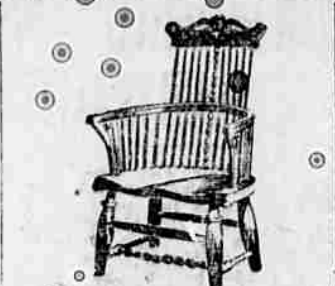
