## DARROW TAKES A RAP AT JUDGE IN EVOLUTION TRIAL

DAYTON, Tenn., July 18.—(A. P.)—While Judge Raulston and attorneys for the prosecution rested today after the arduous duties of the week, counsel for the defense of John Thomas Scopes, charged with violating the Tennessee anti-evolution statute, busied themselves with the preparation of scientific affidavits. These will be brought into court Monday for the purpose of entering them into the record. Primarily they will show in detail the theory of evolution in an endeavor to conform to the story of creation as recorded in the Bible.

Shorn of all hope of producing their science witnesses in court to testify from the stand, defense attorneys after the ruling of Judge Raulston yesterday resorted to this method of having their testimony placed on record for the information of the presiding judge and to reveal to the appellate court the nature of the evidence they would have submitted.

Permission to do this was granted by Judge Raulston yesterday after his ruling that such evidence was not relevant. Exceptions by defense counsel followed, after which it was agreed that the statements should be prepared and admitted to the record.

While Dayton moved calmly and seemingly untroubled about the business, heated statements from members of the defense counsel seemed to indicate that storm clouds were breaking in those quarters. The first indication came yesterday in the form of a none too closely veiled expression from Clarence Darrow to Judge Raulston.

Several of the scientific experts called to testify today were preparing to return to their respective homes after placing their testimony in affidavit form.

Maynard M. Metcalf, former head of the zoological department of Oberlin college and first scientific witness for the defense, left early today.

The exclusion of expert testimony was characterized by John R. Neal, chief counsel for the defense, as the death of the last hope of the defense for winning the trial.

Clarence Darrow was more vehement in his declaration that the defense would seek "justice in the higher courts."

In a statement issued late yesterday he asserted that William Jennings Bryan was responsible for setting the scales in favor of the prosecution.

Mr. Bryan himself declared that under the rules governing the admission of evidence in Tennessee courts, Judge Raulston could not have done otherwise than exclude it.

Attorney-General A. T. Stewart pronounced the decision a glorious victory for the state. The taking of testimony from the scientific witnesses proceeded far into the night, as under the direction of Mr. Darrow a corps of court stenographers busied themselves in preparing the affidavits.
