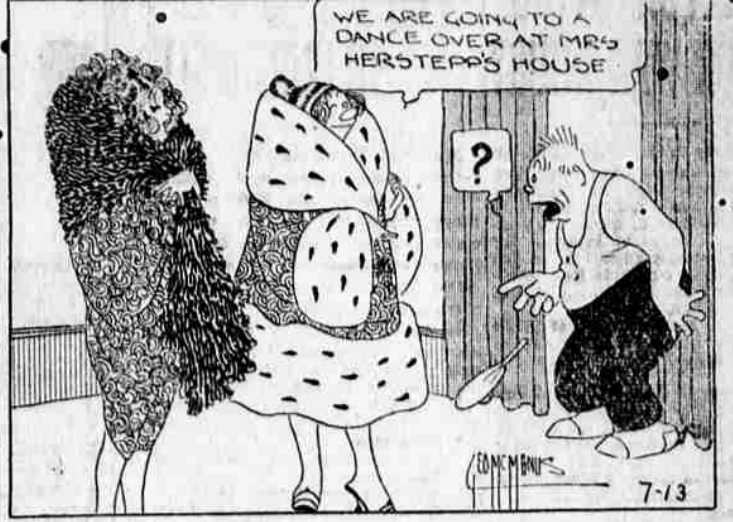
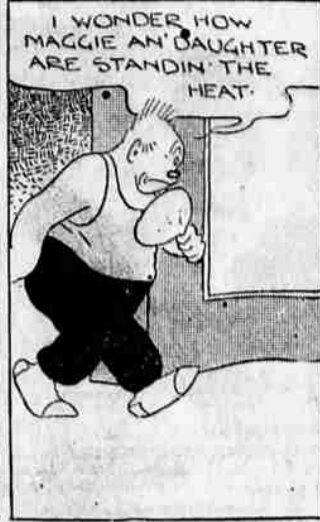

NEW YORK, July 20.—The closing was firm. The interruption from profit-taking was short-lived and prices again swung upwards towards the close. Speculators for the rise turned their attention to the mail order and food issues, lifting Sears-Robuck, Montgomery Ward, United Fruit, Fleischmann, Postum Cereal and Coca Cola to new top prices. Mack Trucks mounted more than five points to a new record of 193 7/8. Stock prices forged steadily ahead today. Pivotal industrials barely held their own but bullish demonstrations made good headway in the mail order, tobacco, motor, rubber and accessory groups. Sales approximated 1,300,000 shares.
