STOCKHOLDERS IN WAR EAGLE MINE INSPECT PROPERTY

John I. Steindl of Chicago and J. J. Work spent the last week in Medford. They have heavy interests in the War Eagle mine and while here went all through the mine, expressing themselves as well pleased with the large extent of development work. This property lies about 25 miles north of Medford in the Meadows mining district.

The Oregon bureau of mines made quite an investigation of the War Eagle and pronounced it the most likely looking prospect developed in the class for many years.

Clifford S. Dennis, an eminent mining engineer, in his report on the property, says "the present development is the first consistent effort that has met with success." He estimates ore in sight to produce 25 tons per day for five years with a profit of over \$400,000.

NEW YORK, July 22.—(A. P.)—Indictments alleging blackmail and extortion were returned today against Philip Siegel, who, it is alleged, demanded \$50,000 with threats to kill Edward W. BOXER KNOCKED FROM RING IN KENTUCKY DIES

LOUISVILLE, July 21.—Mickey Shannon, Chicago lightweight, died in the arena before hundreds of boxing fans here last night at the end of the fourth round of his bout with Harry Fay of Louisville, when Fay drove him to the ropes and so weakened him with head and body blows he collapsed and fell through the ropes, breaking his neck when his head hit the floor.

Fay immediately was arrested on a technical charge of manslaughter, but was released on \$1,000 bonds. The Louisville boxer was depressed over the accident, but refused to comment, except to express his regret over the outcome.

By coincidence last night's fatality marked the second time that a Mickey Shannon had been killed during a boxing bout. Ray McMillan, Frostburg, Md., heavyweight, known in the ring as Mickey Shannon, a few years ago, met the same fate while boxing Al Roberts of New York.

Marble Bust of Jack Dempsey Is Set Up in Berlin

BERLIN, July 22.—(A. P.)—A marble bust of Jack Dempsey has been acquired by the national gallery. It was made by the Italian sculptor, Ernesto de Fiori during the American pugilist's recent Berlin visit. Hans Breitenstrater, German heavyweight, persuaded Dempsey, who at first was reluctant to pose for the bust. In the argument that convinced the champion, Breitenstrater said:

"Look here, Jack, if you get licked you will be forgotten soon. Your only chance of being remembered then would be in this statue. You'd better pose."

Dempsey did.

NEW TRAP SHOOTING RECORD ESTABLISHED

NEW YORK, July 22.—Fred S. Tomlin of Glensboro, N. J., has established a new record trap shooting average for 2000 targets. In competition registered by the American Trap Shooting association up at July 15, Tomlin compiled a mark of 3851, eclipsing any previous record, amateur or professional. The best previous mark was hung up by John Taylor of Newark, Ohio, who finished the 1923 season with an average of 3845 for 2100 targets.

Bantamweight Title At Stake N. Y. Tonight

NEW YORK, July 22.—(A. P.)—The world's bantamweight ring crown which has been toppled from the heads of six champions in five years will be at stake again tonight when Charley (Phil) Rosenberg attempts to retain it against Eddie Shea of Chicago in a fifteen round fight to a decision.

The bout was postponed a week ago to allow the champion more time to train for the bout which marks his greatest since he drew the mantle from the shoulders of Eddie (Cannonball) Martin four months ago.

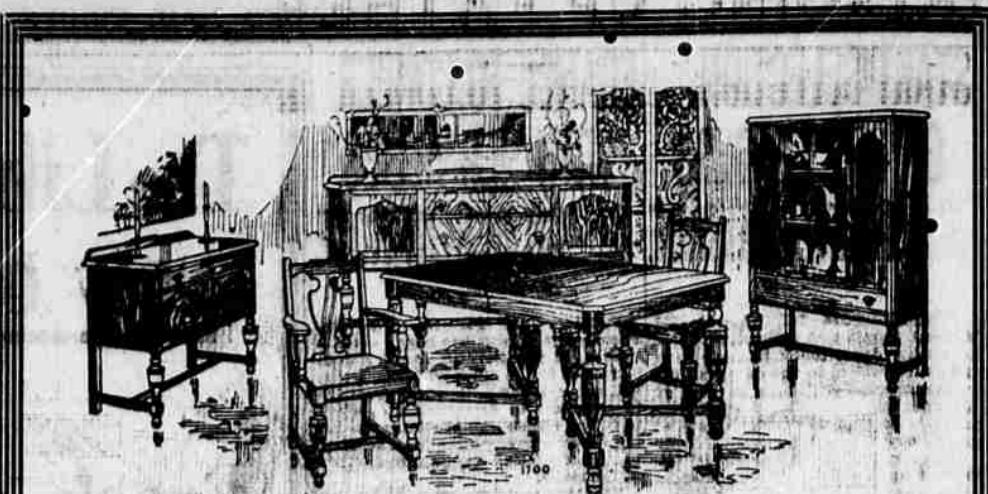
