UPWARD TREND IN MOTOR STOCKS

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—(A. P.)—The upward movement in stock prices, removed in today's brief session of the market although the advance was by no means uniform. Despite the absence of many brokers and traders over the week end there was a good demand for stocks, which was stimulated by favorable trade reports from several of the basic industries.

Motors which were in free supply yesterday as a result of price cuts received better support. Mack Truck selling over two points above yesterday's final quotation and several others moving up a point or so. Heavy buying of trans-continental was one of the features of the oil group. Renewed accumulation was one of the features noted in such issues as Philip Morris, Crucible and General Electric. The closing was firm. Total sales approximated 550,000 shares.

2 BROADWAY SUPPER CLUBS RAIDED

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—(A. P.)—As a result of the battering down with sledgehammers of the doors of two Broadway supper clubs by twelve prohibition agents, five men were under arrest today and the value of the government's stock of seized liquor had increased \$1000.

The raiders were gathered here recently by Federal Attorney Buckner from among agents of accomplishment on the Canadian border.

Padlock proceedings have closed many clubs. Bargain week for party bootleggers ended yesterday in the federal courts with 2000 cases disposed of and a total of \$81,719 in fines.

Other accomplishments of the day were a raid on a cutting plant where three arrests and seizure of \$5000 worth of liquor, the breaking up of mail order plants that sent liquor in trunks and the forfeiting of bail bonds aggregating \$600,000.

Bank Clerks Strike. PARIS, Aug. 1.—The strike of bank clerks is beginning to assume formidable proportions. Strikers in Paris number about 15,000 and the movement is spreading to the provinces. Nantes, Bordeaux, and several smaller cities are affected.
