

CHAMBER OF C. RECEIVES MANY LAND INQUIRIES

CO. PROHIBITION FUND NOW IN SPLENDID SHAPE

During the month of July, prohibition expenditures in this county for enforcement totalled \$349.13. Of this sum, \$29.64 was expended by the sheriff's office and \$319.65 by the district attorney's office.

Fines collected for violations of the prohibition law amounted to \$486, and half of this amount or \$243, reverts to the state prohibition fund.

In the month of July there were four convictions and two acquittals by a jury in the circuit court, all being the trials of R. Dawson and E. J. Hodges and their wives, of Klamath Falls, indicted in connection with a raid on "The Hut," a soft drink establishment, located on the Crater Lake highway near Camp Jackson, during the National Guard encampment.

According to the semi-annual report of the county treasurer, prohibition enforcement cost \$2409 up to July 1st, paid out on warrants, and \$76 paid by the county clerk. Seven hundred and five dollars and twenty-two cents was turned over to the state prohibition fund, under the law requiring 25 per cent, and later 50 per cent of all fines collected. The total fines were \$1437.31, for the six months period.

On July 1 there was a balance of \$277.23 for the first six months of the year in the prohibition fund.

On January 1, 1925, there was a balance of \$224.24 in the prohibition fund, which included the December fines.

The dry fund is in the best shape it has been for months.

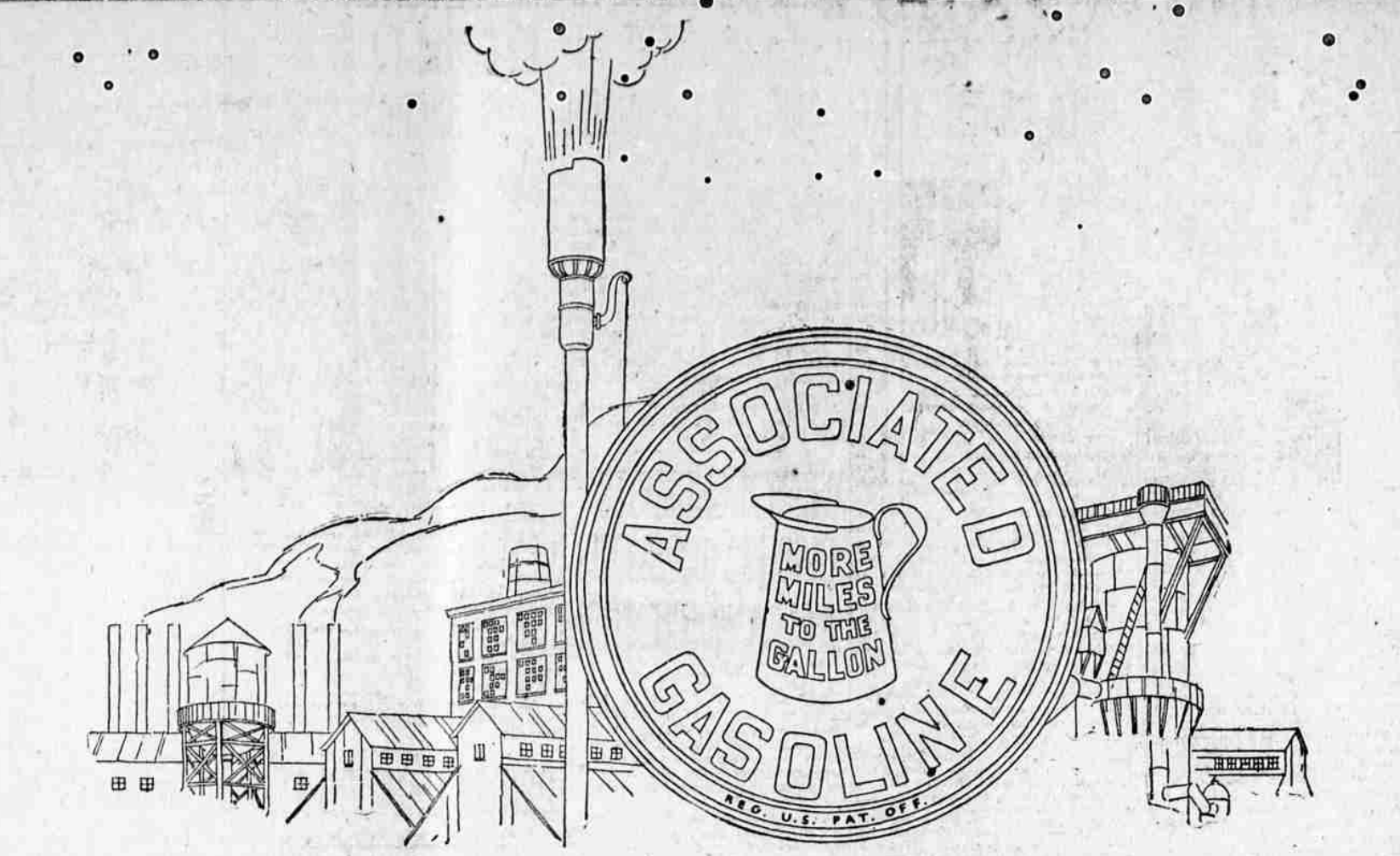
