

CITY BLOCK IN MONTREAL WIPED OUT BY FLAMES

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 25.—(A. P.)—An entire block of buildings in Montreal was laid waste last night and early this morning by one of the most spectacular fires the city ever experienced.

The blaze, under a half gale, spread rapidly and soon enveloped the entire block. The buildings consumed consisted of 29 or more dwellings, a large apartment-house, an ice plant and other houses.

No estimate has been made of the damage. The casualties were comparatively few. Most of those reported consisted of several firemen being overcome by smoke or cut by flying glass.
