CROPS BENEFITTED, FIRES PUT OUT BY RECENT RAINS

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 27.—The crop report for Oregon for the week ending August 25, prepared by the United States department of agriculture, follows: Cool weather prevailed most of the week in northwestern counties, extending to other portions of the state toward the close of the week, culminating in heavy frost in some central and eastern localities. Rain fell over the great part of the state Saturday and Sunday. The precipitation exceeded one inch on the southern coast, and over considerable areas elsewhere was sufficient to be of material benefit to ventilation and to check the spread of forest fires.

EGGS REACH 40 CENT LEVEL AS WEATHER COOLS

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 27.—Top grade eggs have reached the forty cent level in the local market, extras being posted at that level on the dairy exchange. Other grades on the exchange held steady for the day but the undertone of the market is very firm. There is a good shipping outlet at the present time due to the higher levels prevailing in the south and in the eastern markets. This will help to absorb the daily arrivals which have been almost sufficient for the market requirements up to the present time. There are some eggs coming out of the cooler at this level and withdrawals will increase as values work higher. The local butter market continues steady with the milk showing a slight increase. Demand continues good and stocks clean up well. Exchange quotations unchanged.

PIERCE REFUSES TO SAY A WORD ON PEN REPORT

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 27.—Governor Pierce has "nothing to say" regarding the report of the special committee named to investigate conditions at the state penitentiary. Asked as to the nature of the report submitted to him yesterday by Jefferson Myers, one of the members of the committee, who said the investigators had found conditions existing which they thought should be called to the attention of the governor at once, Governor Pierce this morning replied: "I have nothing to say." "Is the report true that Warden Dalrymple has already submitted his resignation?" the governor was asked. "I have nothing to say," he reiterated. "Then you do not care to say whether or not Dalrymple has handed in his resignation?" "There is no resignation here," said the governor, closing the interview.

SALEM HIGH BANS SECRET SOCIETIES

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 27.—Seven social organizations in Salem high school, said by the board to be secret societies, were abolished by action of the Salem school board here last night. All students entering high school next year will be required to sign written statements declaring that they do not belong to any of the organizations. The statements must also be signed by parents or guardians. The ruling will be enforced by suspension or expulsion for non-compliance. It was stated by school officials this morning.
