Five traffic violators were fined in local justice courts yesterday and today. Edward Joslyn of San Francisco received a 30 day jail sentence on his plea of guilty in Judge Taylor's court yesterday, to a charge of reckless driving, preferred against him by State Traffic officer J. J. McMahon as a result of an auto wreck Sunday evening, when Joslyn struck a car driven by J. B. Shaw near Phipps Auto Park Service. As a result of the accident, which happened while Joslyn is alleged to have been traveling at a rate exceeding 40 miles an hour, two men, J. B.
