

CHRISTIAN CHURCH PLANS TO BUILD A CHURCH ANNEX

At the monthly business meeting of the board of elders and deacons of the First Christian church, it was unanimously decided to build an annex to the present building. For some time the matter has been under consideration and careful plans are being worked out to make room for the wing needs of the bible school and social life of the young people. The proposed building will be 62x20 ft., two stories high, and will include vocational and dining hall, large church, seven splendid individual rooms, and other conveniences. The church has a resident membership of more than 400, and a bible school which has outgrown the present building, and necessitates the additional room to carry on this large work in a successful manner. With an annex it will make one of the most complete and useful plants in northern Oregon. The action of the board will be presented to the entire congregation on next Sunday morning for approval, and work on the new building will no doubt begin in a few days.
