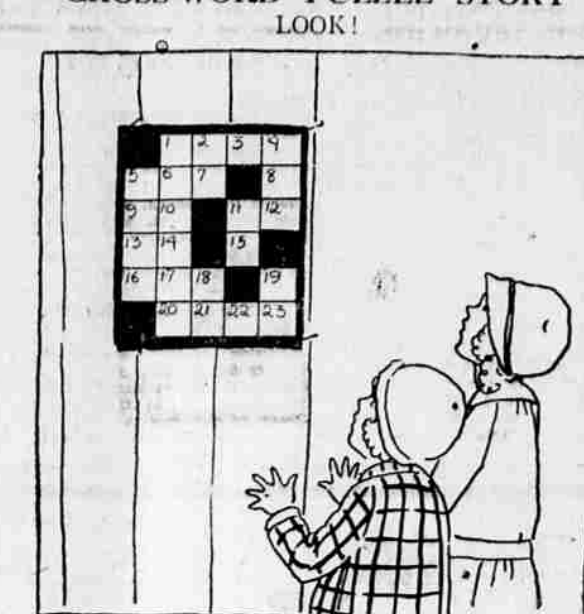
BOY ESCAPES FROM JAIL AT ROSEBURG
