We are weak mortals, and though the head condemns the saxonophone the feet are secretly intrigued.

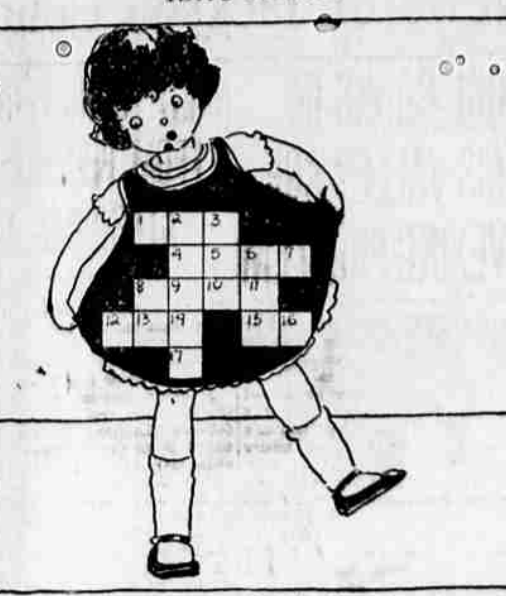

Personal Health Service

Lime for Disinfection. Lime, unslacked lime, quicklime, calcium oxid, as it is variously called, is made by calcining (heating, roasting, or partly burning in kilns) limestone, chalk or marble.

Lime is cheap enough to permit of its liberal use for disinfecting and deodorizing organic matter of any kind, particularly excreta.

Whitewash is slacked lime mixed with water. Quicklime, formerly used in the disposal of dead bodies, is just ordinary lime.

Milk of lime is slacked lime mixed with from four to eight times its volume of water to the consistency of thick cream, and this, when freshly prepared, is the best form in which to apply lime for disinfection or deodorization of organic matter.

Slaking means mixing the lime with water, in the proportion of about two pounds of lime to one pint of water.

The common lime used by masons is the right thing for disinfecting or deodorizing organic filth.

From this same common lime the now less popular lime water is prepared, by slaking a piece of lime as big as a walnut in two quarts of boiling water in an earthen jar, stirring well and allowing to settle; the clear upper liquid is then lime water.

"If Nathan Leopold, Jr., and Richard Loeb had been hanged the kidnapping and murder of little Mary Daly of Montclair, N. J., might have been prevented," asserted State Attorney Robert E. Crowe, of Chicago.

prosecutor in the famed trial. "The only way to stop the wave of murder in this country is by showing no mercy to murderers."

"Here's something that's as simple as that two and two make four; hangings do act as a deterrent of murder. I wish we could make jurors believe it."

"The fact is that jurors won't believe it—not often enough. We get men on juries who say they will not hesitate to inflict the death penalty 'in a proper case,' and then we show them a proper case, and frequently one man will dissuade the other eleven from doing the proper thing."

"That's one of the reasons for my belief that Judge Caverly's decision in the Leopold-Loeb case has done tremendous harm, not only in Chicago, but throughout the country. Jurors have felt justified in following his example and extended clemency even though there might be nothing resembling a mitigating circumstance."

"Young Noel, who confessed that shocking crime in New Jersey, was a college student, as were Leopold and Loeb. Like them, his father is wealthy. Perhaps he got the idea of kidnapping Mary Daly for ransom from the crime of Leopold and Loeb."

Effect of Clemency "Now it is learned that he is mentally deficient. I'm sure that no matter how crazy he might be, he probably would not have attempted that crime if Leopold and Loeb were hanged. Undoubtedly he heard of the leniency extended them. Even a crazy man has the instincts of self preservation, and one wouldn't commit murder if he knew that absolutely and positively it meant his own death at the end of a rope."

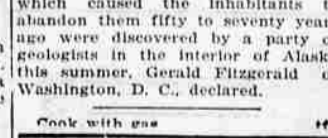
