Last Saturday work on the 500 foot level of the Irish Girl vein of the Greenback mine uncovered high grade telluride ore running into several hundred dollars a ton in gold. In fact some of the ore is so rich that it is worth several dollars a pound.

The Greenback mine was discovered in the late 90's and its past record of production is about \$2,500,000. Less than a year ago it was purchased by L. E. Klupp of Portland who has since been rehabilitating the property and who has just developed an ore body of high grade gold ore.

Details have just been released of the recent rich strike of gold ore on the Mood property on Fiddler's Gulch in the Kerby district. This property adjoins the Hittany, and in carrying on the development work the owners ran into a rich pay streak about two feet wide, the ore being exceedingly rich, being shot full of free gold.

HAWLEY FORECASTS TAXATION SLASH

Notice of Special Election and Submission of Charter Amendments to the People at Said Election. ORDINANCE NO. 1732

Section 1. Resolutions numbered 65 and 66 shall be filed forthwith with the City Recorder for submission to the legal voters of the City of Medford at the special election hereinafter called for that purpose.

Section 2. A special city election is hereby called to be held in the City of Medford, on Thursday, the 8th day of October, 1925, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters the aforesaid charter amendments.

Section 3. The manner of giving notice of said election shall be by the distribution of pamphlets in accordance with Section 4495, Oregon Laws, and by the publication of a copy of this ordinance in five issues of the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper published in Medford, Jackson County, Oregon.

Beginning at the southwest corner of Section 29, Township 37, South Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian, and running thence north along the west boundary of Higherfort Addition to the northwest corner, thence thence East along the north line of Higherfort Addition to the northeast corner thereof; thence south along the east line of Higherfort Addition to its intersection with the section line between Sections 2 and 29, Township 37, South Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence east along said section line to the quarter section corner between said Sections 20 and 29; thence northerly to the northwest corner of Capitol Hill Addition; being the northeast corner of the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of said Section 20; thence east along the north line of Capitol Hill Addition to a point directly north of the northeast corner of the city reservoir site, as described in the record, column 71, page 531 thereof; thence south along the east line of the city reservoir site to the southeast corner thereof; thence east to the northeast corner of the El Mar Addition; thence south along the east line of El Mar Addition, now vacated, to the southeast corner thereof; thence south to the section line between said Sections 20 and 29; thence east to the section corner between said Sections 20 and 29, Township 37, South Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence south on the section line between said sections 20 and 29 to the south side of the country road; thence west along the south line of said country road to the northeast corner of Siskiyou Heights Extension; thence south along the east line of Siskiyou Heights Extension to the southeast corner of the El Mar Addition; thence west along the west line of Siskiyou Heights Extension, being the present city limits to the northeast corner of Siskiyou Heights Addition; thence west along the north line of Siskiyou Heights Addition to the northeast corner thereof; thence northerly along the present city limits to the northeast corner of Queen Anne Addition; thence westerly along the north line of Queen Anne Addition to the place of beginning.
