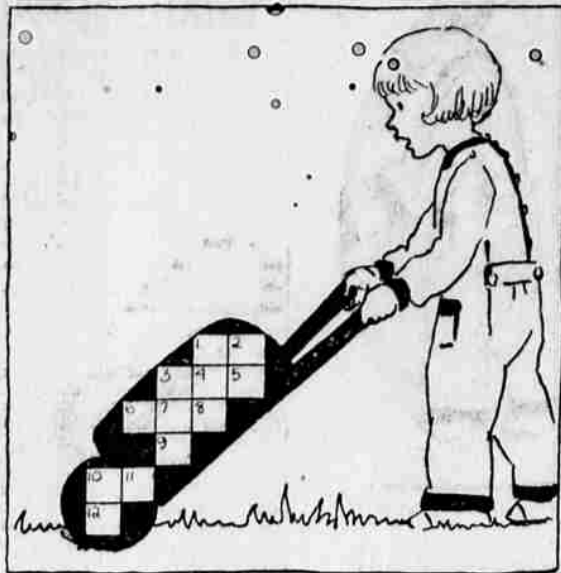
THE DISCHARGE OF COLONEL MITCHELL
