

PARALYTIC CASE IS PUZZLING, REAL DR. REICH ALIVE

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 24.—(A. P.)—Dr. Nathaniel Reich, head of the department of Egyptology at Dropsic college was surprised today when informed that a man giving his name and profession had been picked up paralyzed and blind on a high-way near Vancouver, Wash. He said he had no relatives in the far west and was completely mystified over the report.

VANCOUVER, Wash., Sept. 24.—(A. P.)—The paralyzed man who was picked up on the Pacific high-way fifteen miles north of here Monday night, who gave his name as Dr. Nathaniel Reich, Egyptologist, of Philadelphia, insisted today at the hospital at Ridgefield that he is Dr. Reich. He stated that effects in his suitcase would identify him, but when the suitcase was opened nothing to bear out his identification was found. The only thing in his possession connecting him with Dr. Nathaniel Reich was a newspaper clipping which referred to work of Dr. Reich.

The man in the hospital insisted he had a brother, William Reich, living on Leg street, Philadelphia. The patient at the Ridgefield hospital is paralyzed and insists he is blind. While speaking with a reporter this morning, however, he gave the impression that he could see by the way he deposited the ashes of a cigarette he was smoking.
