INJUNCTION FILED BY W. S. BARNUM SERVED ON P. S. C.

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 24.—Two complaints in injunction proceedings, one in Multnomah county and one in Jackson county, were served on the public service commission here today. In the Multnomah county case the Covey Motor Car company, the Fushion Garage and the Franklin Garage, all of Portland, seek to enjoin the commission from bringing under its jurisdiction towing cars that are operated by garages. The commission has interpreted the motor transportation act passed by the 1921 legislature as including these cars among those that pay fees to the state. In the Jackson county case W. S. Barnum, owner of the Medford-Jacksonville railroad, seeks to enjoin the commission from enforcing an order which would prevent Barnum from dismantling the road pending a hearing. Barnum has already been enjoined by the cities of Medford and Jacksonville from dismantling the road. He claims the road is without the jurisdiction of the commission for the reason that it has not been operated as a common carrier for two years.
