

GERMANY ANXIOUS FOR ALLIED TALKS ABOUT SECURITY

BERLIN, Sept. 25.—(A. P.) The German delegates to the security conference invitation to which was accepted by the cabinet yesterday, are expected to carry on important private conversations with the allied statesmen while the negotiations for the security pact are proceeding. In fact, interest in political circles here centers quite as much in these private talks as in the formal conversations on the security issue.

It is recalled that the value of the London reparations conference lay as much in the gentlemen's agreements reached between the Germans and allied delegates as in the adoption of the Dawes plan.

The Germans at the forthcoming meeting, the date and site for which are yet to be fixed, will stress privately that hand in hand with the security pact must go the following:

Reduction of Germany's burden of maintaining occupational forces. Immediate evacuation of the Cologne bridgehead held by the British. Advancement of the plebiscite in the Saare valley to a date earlier than provided in the Versailles treaty.

Rescinding of the League of Nations decision to conduct investigations in Germany from time to time in which Germany sees merely a perpetuation of the military control commission.

The pro-government organs are declaring that permanent renunciation of Alsace-Lorraine constitutes such a heavy sacrifice that Germany should be compensated by these concessions.

CHURCH PAPER IS SUED FOR LIBEL BY DRY LEADER

NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—(A. P.)—William H. Anderson, former state superintendent of the Anti-Saloon League announced today that he had instructed counsel to bring suit against the Christian Century, a religious publication of Chicago for \$50,000 alleging libel.

The basis of the suit, Anderson said, was the statement in the paper that he had "served time for misuse of funds of the Anti-Saloon League." In January, 1924, Anderson was convicted of third degree forgery in connection with the "splitting" of commissions with a former league fund solicitor. Anderson was sentenced to a year in Sing Sing and was paroled after nine months. Asserting that he welcomed the prospect of taking the witness stand in his behalf, "in a court room not controlled by an anti-Protestant political machine," the former dry leader today said his duty to the cause of prohibition, to his family and to himself, "compels me to take advantage of this chance to get the merits of my case aired in the federal courts."

altitude of 6065 feet, the gas bags were under pressure. Alleby testified. Chief Gunner Raymond Cole estimated that it was approximately 4:30 a. m. central time, when he passed the ship's galley and saw thermos bottles and canned goods falling down in the keels of the ship. This was when the Shenandoah was on the first flight up just before she began the uncontrolled ascent with her bow sticking almost straight up in the air. Further testimony that no sound of gas cells giving way before the breakup of the ship was given by William Richardson, navy photographer on board. Richardson was in his bunk when the vessel began to pitch.

Chief Aviation Flinger Louis Alleby also declared he had heard no sound indicating rupture of the helium gas cells. Alleby said he actually saw the cars containing engines four and five break loose from the Shenandoah in the air. This was at 4:40 a. m., central time, by the clock in the crew's space about the time the ship broke up, he said.
