ORDINANCE NO. 1732. AN ORDINANCE calling a special election providing for the submission of certain charter amendments to the people at said election and making provision for said election.

WHEREAS the City Council has adopted resolutions proposing certain charter amendments to be referred to the people, which said resolutions are numbered 65 and 66; and

WHEREAS it is necessary that a special election be called to vote on said amendments and that provision be made for the holding of said election; now, therefore,

THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOETH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. Resolutions numbered 65 and 66 shall be filed forthwith with the City Recorder for submission to the legal voters of the City of Medford, on Thursday, the 8th day of October, 1925, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters the aforesaid charter amendments. The polls for the receipt of ballots shall

be open at the hour of eight o'clock A. M. and close at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. on the aforesaid date.

The manner of giving notice of said election shall be by the distribution of pamphlets in accordance with Section 4195, Oregon Laws, and by the publication of a notice of said election in five issues of the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper published in Medford, Jackson County, Oregon.
