KLAMATH HOME IS SET FIRE TO AFTER ROBBERY

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Oct. 1.—Four robbers yesterday afternoon entered the home of E. W. Reinking, on the main street of Chiloquin, on the Klamath Indian reservation, and set fire to the house after stealing \$115 in cash and \$73 in checks.

The interior of the house was badly damaged by flames before neighbors aided in putting the fire under control. Walter Jacobson, Chiloquin resident, was brought here today and placed in the county jail as a suspect.

According to Deputy District Attorney Weist, Jacobson was recognized by a Chiloquin girl as one of the four men seen leaving the house. The authorities also say Jacobson has been identified as a man who passed one of the stolen checks at the Klamath Supply house.

The girl who is reported to have identified Jacobson also gave the authorities the name of another man she claims to have seen, and he is now being sought. No description could be given of the other two men, according to the sheriff's office.

GORE AND GARDNER URGE CAVES ROAD

Relative to a local delegation having appeared before the state highway commission at Portland this week a news telegram from that city says:

"A new road to Oregon Caves was proposed in a petition presented by W. H. Gore of Medford and former County Judge Gardner of Jackson county, asking for the creation of a highway improvement district in Jackson and Josephine counties. The commission will call a hearing on the proposed boundaries at Jacksonville in the near future.

"It is proposed to build a road from Williams in the Applegate valley up Williams creek to the caves."

Charged with overloading a truck, Vern Stevenson, arrested by State Traffic Officer J. J. McMahon yesterday, entered a plea of not guilty when arraigned in Judge J. L. Roe's court at Jacksonville. His case is set for tomorrow. It is alleged that the truck, loaded with logs, carried an overload of 6900 pounds on the rear axle.

The driver was arrested just as he was entering the mill yards to dump the logs at the Tomlin sawmill. Officers say that this is the 7th case of overloading occurring on the trucks owned by J. T. Brewer within the past five months.

Cowboy Earl Won't Get Vast British Estate



Oliver Henry Wallop, Wyoming cowboy made Earl of Portsmouth by the death of his elder brother, does not become possessed of the earldom's estates, amounting to 100,000 acres of choice English land. Through an agreement made some years ago with his brother, the land passes to his U. S.-born son, Gerard Wallop, now Viscount Lymington. Young Wallop, whose wife is American, is a British army lieutenant.

ALL CONVICTS AT SALEM WORKING

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 1.—Governor Pierce said today that for the first time in some years every able-bodied man in the state penitentiary is employed and has been for several days. Over 500 men are in the prison.

Most of those at work are in the flax industry. The governor said that the state now carries \$125,000 insurance on the prison flax. About \$40,000 worth of flax that was raised by farmers in this district for a projected linen mill at Vancouver, Wash., but the project failed to materialize and the state has purchased the flax from the farmers.

OREGON HARVESTS RECORD CROP IN ENGLISH WALNUTS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 1.—Under ideal weather conditions Oregon growers are starting to harvest their record walnut crops. Conservative estimates place the tonnage under 700,000 pounds with close to 500,000 pounds in the Dundee section alone.

Quality and size is the best ever produced here with fifteen per cent running to jumbos, fifty per cent to large and 25 per cent in medium sizes. The weather during the past two weeks has been just right and all the blighted nuts are off the trees.

While the crop this year is a record it is short of earlier estimates. Growers had expected a much larger crop on account of the increased acreage but the light yield around Eugene brought the total figures down.

The Dundee crop has been sold and nothing is now offered. The association expects to start delivering in another week. Already several tons are in the driers.

The advance continues in the local egg market with bids posted one to two cents higher on the dairy exchange today. Extras and firsts are a cent higher at 48 and 44 cents respectively while pullets and current receipts advanced two cents to forty and 38 cents respectively.

The local butter market continues steady with prices unchanged on both cubes and prints. Demand is good and production light.
