## VOTE THESE AMENDMENTS THURSDAY

Vote for the amendment to the charter authorizes the City Council to provide for the waiving of penalty and interest on delinquent paving, sewer and water main assessments, on lots foreclosed by the City, provided the original owner will pay up the assessments within one year.

Portland and Roseburg have successfully adopted these means in dealing with delinquent assessments.

If this be voted by the people it will allow the City to expend approximately \$10,000 in repairing its pavements and grading streets, putting in gutters, culverts, street lights, and the many other necessities that the City is now unable to provide, and not cost the taxpayers any more. The old saying is "A stitch in time saves nine." We believe it will cost less to make the paving and street repairs before they grow worse; keep the Fire Department and other departments in good condition and give better service to our citizens, than to let any of them deteriorate and go to pieces, as they are now doing and then have to renew them all at once.

A proposal, in this amendment, that the councilmen be elected for four year terms, one of the two councilmen from each ward being elected each two years. By this method there will always be one councilman in each ward who is familiar with the city business and conversant with the interest of the people who have elected him.

In order that Medford might have the headquarters for Crater Lake National Park, the Council, at the suggestion of the Chamber of Commerce and other civic bodies of the city, last year agreed to donate a residence lot in Queen Anne Addition for a government residence for the Superintendent of the Park, and a lot on North Central Avenue for a headquarters warehouse.

A vote to ratify the action of the city will assure the retention of the park headquarters in Medford. A vote against ratifying will lose the headquarters to some of the other Southern Oregon towns, probably Klamath Falls, who are leaving no stone unturned to obtain it.
