DRY REPORT BY CHURCH COUNCIL RAISES TURMOIL

WASHINGTON, Oct.—Inquiries as to the precise nature and purposes of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America have flooded the organization since its research department published a report on the social consequences of prohibition. The federal council is described by its officials as an organization through which 28 Protestant communions, with an adult communicant membership of more than 20,000,000 persons, carry on cooperative work. It was organized at Philadelphia in 1908, its purpose being stated in the constitution as "for the prosecution of work that could be better done in union than in separation." The aims of the council are: To express the fellowship and Catholic unity of the Christian church. To bring the Christian bodies of America into united service for Christ and the world. To encourage devotional fellowship and mutual counsel concerning the spiritual life and religious activities of the churches. To secure a larger combined influence for the Churches of Christ in all matters affecting the moral and social condition of the people so as to promote the application of the law of Christ in every relation of human life. The council itself consists of about 400 members elected by the various communions. It meets once every four years. The executive committee, consisting of official representatives of the constituent bodies, meets once a year. The administrative committees meet once a month. The Rev. Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, pastor of the Central Congregational church, Brooklyn, is president of the Federal Council. Bishop John M. Moore of Dallas, Texas, of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, is chairman of the executive committee, and the Rev. Dr. John A. Marquiss of the Presbyterian board of national missions is chairman of the administrative committee. Frank H. Mann, president of the Union Mortgage company, is treasurer. The Rev. Dr. Charles S. Macfarland and the Rev. Samuel McCrea Cavert are the general secretaries. The Federal Council of Churches works through commissions and committees. It has the following commissions: Evangelical, the Rev. William Horace Day, Bridgeport, Conn., chairman; social service, Bishop F. J. McConnell, Pittsburg, chairman; race relations, Bishop George C.
