

Tired of Being 'Dead' Victim of Feud Gives Up

NEW YORK, Oct. 16.—(A. P.)—William H. Turner, former coal mine foreman of feudist Pike county, Kentucky, tired of being "dead in Germany," is again in this country to face charges of murdering the unidentified miner whose tombstone bears Turner's name. He also is accused of the murder of Henry Wilson, another mine worker killed in a mysterious explosion in a coal mine at McCarr, Kentucky.

The fatal explosion was considered an accident until Turner, who blames others for the affair, got home sick in Hamburg and wrote to a Kentucky friend a letter that reached the authorities.

When Turner, under weight from short rations and with his belongings in a papermache suitcase, stepped off the gangplank of the steamer Resolute, arriving from Hamburg yesterday, he was greeted by Taylor Hatfield, one of the famous feudist clan and a deputy sheriff of Pike county. Hatfield showed Turner a warrant for his arrest.

Mrs. Turner, who has been living in Trenton, N. J., with her five children since she and Turner's sister, Mrs. F. P. Farley of Coral Gables, Fla., collected \$68,000 after Turner's supposed death, said she had thought her husband dead and had been bringing up her children in that belief.

She said she had no part in identification of the body.

In Williamson, W. Va., Joe Jacks, Turner's father-in-law, who was an electrician for the mine at the time of the explosion last January, has been arrested also.

"We were blasting in the new cut," Turner began his story to Hatfield and the New York police yesterday. "Henry Wilson and some other men were setting dynamite charges. I was in another part of the mine."

Ordinarily, according to Turner, it is a safe and simple thing to attach wires to a dynamite charge, but the circuit must have closed and the explosive went off as soon as the wires touched it. Wilson and his companion were blown to pieces.

"I didn't know anything about it," continued Turner. "A brother-in-law of mine took me out to drink some white mule. He wouldn't let me go where anyone could see me. He kept making me drink and when I was good and drunk he pulled a gun on me and said I would have to get out of town and stay out. He told me where to go and what to do. I went."

The remains of Wilson were identified and when Turner's absence continued for several days, the other body, badly mangled, but about the right weight and measurements, was identified as his. An insurance company paid his "widow" and his sister his insurance without protest.

Turner went to Columbus, Ohio, and thence to New York, where he was met by his father-in-law, Joe Jacks, who had tickets for Norway. From Norway, Turner went to Hamburg.

PLEADS FOR R. R. EXTENSION

Judge G. A. Gardner said it would be a great step backward to dismantle this road in face of the great timber resources and other natural resources of Applegate valley, when an extension would bring a payroll to Medford and Jacksonville. He pointed to the preservation of the P. & E. and its resultant effects, as to what might be accomplished by extending the Jacksonville-Medford road.

William H. Gore stated that he had been very much interested in an extension of the Medford-Jacksonville line; that it should be done and that not to exceed a 2 per cent grade and 10 degree curvature could be obtained in crossing the divide. He further stated it would be a calamity to Medford to have this road removed just when there is such a development in prospect, and that the preservation of this road and extension of it would mean a duplication of the P. & E. development.

J. D. Gaston, who owns the Trail Lumber company, located on this line, said removal of the road would put him out of business; that he controls a body of 100,000,000 feet of timber that could be worked by a two or three mile extension.

W. S. Barnum offers to take \$12,000 for the road and take stock, so he announced at the meeting.

Fred A. Williams of Salem handled the case for Jacksonville and John H. Carlin and H. C. Skyrman handled the case for Medford. Williams said that in view of the case just finished in Portland before the Interstate Commerce commission, where the Northern lines are seeking permission to build into Klamath, that it only pre-empted the greatest railroad development in Oregon, and especially interesting to southern Oregon, and particularly Rogue river valley.

Mr. Williams also said that it means that it will be only a year or so until a trans-state line is constructed across southern Oregon to the coast. Coos bay is fighting now for the terminal of such line, and the Rogue river valley seems indifferent. Williams said yet the Northern line, if granted this permission, will be right at Medford's back door awaiting to get in.

"Take opportunity, it may only knock once," he asserted, "and now to dismantle this Jacksonville-Medford line would be criminal. It can be bought for \$12,000 and the Medford-Jacksonville business men should immediately get together and take it over, and clear the decks for action."
