PASTOR ACCUSED OF CHURCH THEFT IN BAPTIST ROW

Another legal document in the long preliminary skirmish between the Ashland Baptist church and the First Baptist church of Ashland, was filed in the circuit court Monday. It is the answer of the plaintiff, followers of the True Baptist faith, to the defendant, followers of the Aimee McPherson Four Square Gospel. Denials and new charges, tinged with bitterness, mark the latest step.

The answer alleges that B. C. Miller, pastor of the Aimee McPherson flock, "through deceit, fraud, and undue influence, sought to deprive the plaintiff of its church property," and that the incorporation of the "First Baptist church," was "mere subterfuge for a selfish purpose, to obtain possession of church property." It is held that while the Ashland Baptist church was never incorporated as the "First Baptist church," it was recognized as such.

The alleged attempt to secure the church property is characterized as a violation and transgression of "the commandment which says: 'Thou shalt not steal,' and the one which says: 'Thou shalt not covet anything that is thy neighbor's.'" The answer denies that members have been barred from the church, "but that all are welcome as long as they act with decorum, and not cause the church to be an object of ridicule, and be a detriment to the Christian religion."

It is denied that the "church was seized by stealth last July," and further emphasizes the intention of the regulars to retain possession, and cites the fact that the Rev. B. C. Miller occupies the parsonage, though dismissed as pastor.

The Four Square Gospel is accused in the answer of being "unseemly, disgusting and ludicrous," and the action of the various county and state Baptist councils in upholding the old church, is upheld.

It was thought that the hearing of the case would be put on the calendar for the October term of court, but it is not listed. The case has been hanging fire for nearly a year, and the factional row is the outgrowth of the Dr. Price revival meetings, held in Ashland in 1923.

LOYD-GEORGE IS FAVORABLE TO A BRITISH SAHARA

LONDON, Oct. 20.—(A. P.)—Former Prime Minister David Lloyd-George, prior to his visit to the United States some time ago, had heard the suggestion that prohibition in that country had been put through by cranks, but he found this entirely untrue, for he never met a man who would vote for the re-establishment of the saloon.

Mr. Lloyd-George was speaking at City Temple on "the responsibilities of the free churchmen." He declared that prohibition was an "experiment Great Britain should investigate."

"It's no use in indulging in slapdash condemnation of America," he said. "Not only have the Americans carried prohibition, but no political party in America now dares propose abolition of prohibition. As politicians, the Americans beat us at every turn."

CIVIL WAR IN CHINA EXPECTED TO BE RESUMED

SHANGHAI, Oct. 20.—(A. P.)—Renewal of civil war in China, hitherto localized to the district between Shanghai and Hankow today assumed a more serious aspect with the return to the political and military arena of Wu Pei-Fu, military dictator at Peking from 1922 to 1924, and the mutiny of two Kiangsu divisions who hitherto have acknowledged the leadership of Chang Tso-Lin, the Manchurian militarist.

Marshal Wu, who since he was thrust from power a year ago by the combination of Chang Tso-Lin and Feng Yu-Shiang, the Christian general, "has been in semi-retirement in central China, has definitely announced his opposition to Peking and to Chang Tso-Lin at Mukden."

Advices to Reuter's agency here say that he is expected to arrive today in Hankow and there announce his assumption of the title of commander in chief of the central provinces, this alliance to include Kiangsu, in which Shanghai is located; Chekiang, Anhui, Kiangsi, Hupei, and Fukien.

PEKING, Oct. 20.—(A. P.)—The continued withdrawal of Marshal Chang Tso-Lin's troops before the advancing Chekiang forces gives point to Chang's reported determination not to be drawn into conflict except as a last resort.

The Manchurian war lord has telegraphed the cabinet ministers stating that he is in complete agreement with the Peking government's desire to preserve peace and inclined to disregard the provocative attentions of the Chekiang governor. His attitude is favorably commented upon in the Chinese press.

PASSENGERS SAY CREW ON CLYDE LINER INTOXICATED

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—(A. P.)—Charges are made by survivors returning home that members of the negro crew of the Clyde liner Comanche, which burned off the Florida coast Saturday were drunk and caused passengers to be hurled out of the lifeboats into the water.

H. B. Raymond, president of the Clyde steamship line denies the charges.

"The Comanche was one of our best ships and Captain E. E. Curry, one of our most trusted captains," said Mr. Raymond. "If the crew had been drunk he would not have left port."

Dispatches from Florida and statements of survivors arriving or passing through here give a picture of demoralization of the crew when the fire was discovered. Passengers are depicted as having been calm at a time when members of the crew were pulling them from lifeboats and upsetting boats in haste to get off the hot upper deck.

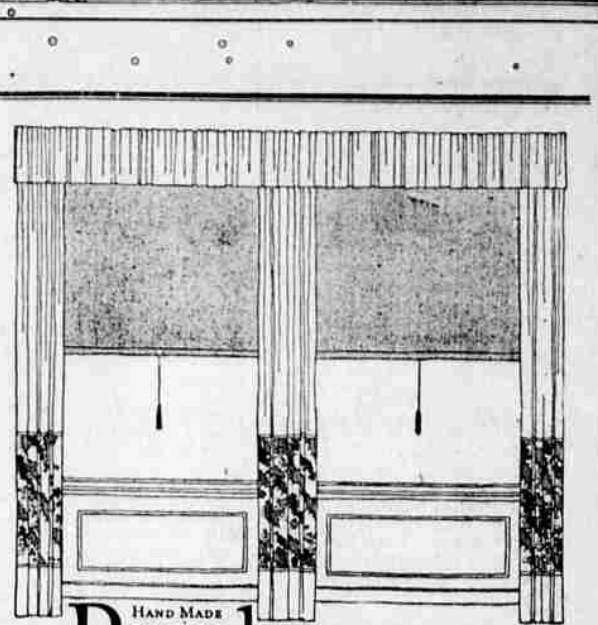
The only one of the 167 passengers unaccounted for is William J. Lawler of Winthrop, Mass., who is believed to have been drowned.
