

**MARU AND FUJI  
TO PLAY MONDAY  
FOR CITY TITLE**

A billiard match to be played next Monday and Tuesday evenings at Brown's billiard parlor, between Fuji, city champion, and Maru, challenger, for the possession of the Roddy trophy cup, won by the latter in last year's tournament, will attract the attention of the many local billiard fans, together with the announcement today that another billiard tournament, similar to last year's, in which 20 of the city's best players will take part, will be held during November. The challenge match to be held Monday and Tuesday will be free. In this match Fuji will play 450 points to Maru's 400 for two night's play. The tournament to be held in November will be the fourth in the city's billiard history, the third having been held last year after several years had elapsed with none taking place. Prizes will be donated by merchants to the winners. It is rumored about in billiard circles that a Portland team is planning to play Medford players, but as yet no arrangements have been announced.
