

POSTAL RECEIPTS AT LOCAL OFFICE SHOWS INCREASE

The monthly report of the Medford postoffice receipts shows a substantial gain for October, over the receipts of a year ago, and indications are that the present month's receipts will show a very large gain over those of November a year ago.

Aiding in the increased business here for the present month will be the annual automobile license postal revenues. Already many hundreds of blanks for the 1926 auto licenses are being received at the local postoffice from the secretary of state's office, for this section, and there are hundreds more coming. In the postoffice this morning there were approximately 1000 blanks for Dodge and Ford cars alone, awaiting delivery.

Blank proposals for prospective bidders on the star route mail delivery contracts for the next four years, 1926 to 1930, have been received by Postmaster Warner. Bids on these contracts will be received at the postoffice department at Washington up to 4:30 p. m. January 19, next.

Among star routes radiating from the Medford postoffice are the route between Medford and Jacksonville, and that between Medford and Butte Falls. These contracts provide for the hauling of mail between the respective towns on each route, and box delivery that may be required between the terminal offices.

These blanks can now be obtained at the Medford postoffice.
