**DEMOCRATS WILL
ASK A REVISION
OF TARIFF BILL**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6.—(A. P.)—General revision of the tariff act will be sought at the coming session of congress by Representative Cordell Hull of Tennessee, former democratic national chairman, a member of the house ways and means committee, in charge of such legislation.

Mr. Hull and Representative Oldfield of Arkansas, chairman of the democratic congressional committee, will present a resolution to the house asking that the ways and means committee be empowered to draft a tariff bill. Neither Mr. Hull or Oldfield has outlined a definite plan for revision. Chairman Green of the committee said today he would oppose any revision of the act, believing it would be unwise to "tinker at all with the tariff" unless it were gone over thoroughly.
