1765 CARLOADS OF PEARS SHIPPED

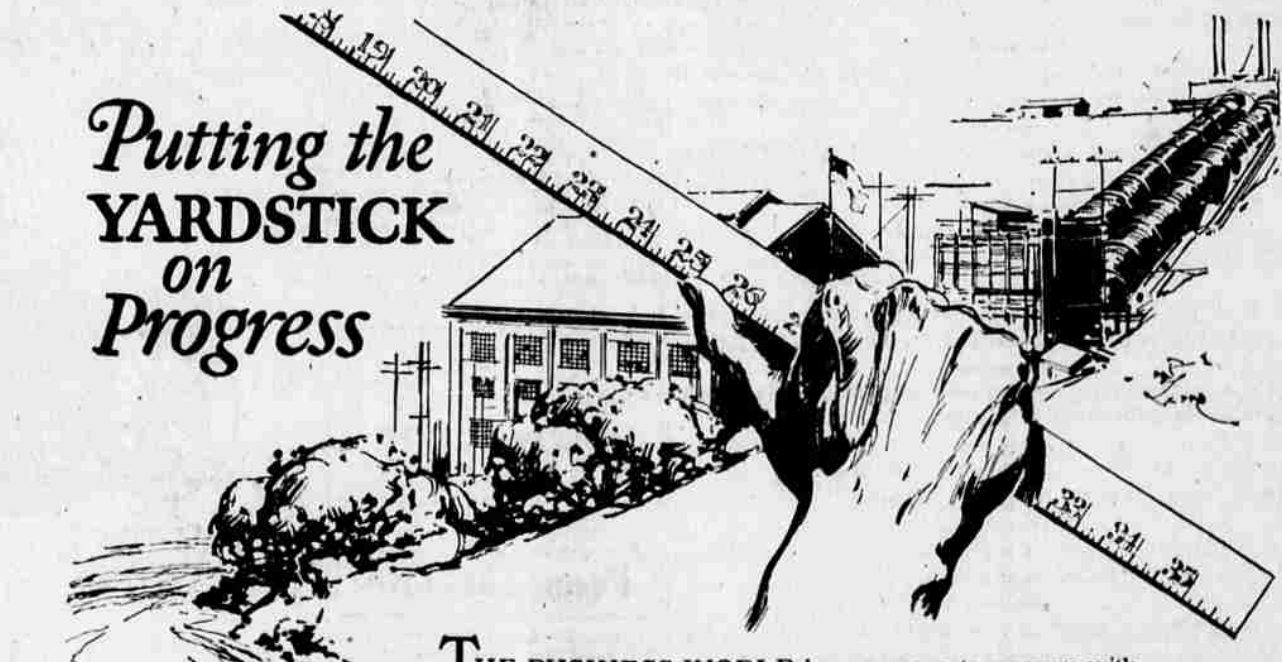
