### Condensed Program of the Day

**8 a. m. Merchants' Bargains**  
For the convenience of those who wish to shop, five merchants have arranged to stay open until 11 a. m. Many special sales and tempting bargains will be offered for the benefit of the out of town visitors. A careful study of the advertising reproduced herewith will convince you of the advisability of purchasing your supplies on this day.

**9 a. m. Street Stunts and Outdoor Entertainment.**  
Let's start the day off with a bang! Join with the Legion in making this the biggest and best patriotic celebration ever staged in this part of the state. Those who come early will not be disappointed for a whitening program of side-splitting street stunts and open-air vaudeville will provide plenty of entertainment for young and old. There will be something doing every minute.  
Motion pictures will be taken of the day's events so put on your "glad rags," folks, and prepare to take part in the "snaps."  
The Legion Golf Links will be open all day, bring your clubs and be prepared to play a round or two on this new course.

**10 a. m. Athletic Exhibition.**  
H. G. LeRoy, Premier American athlete in ability tests of strength. Here's a feature you don't want to miss. Mr. LeRoy, late of Panhandle vaudeville circuit, will entertain you with a startling "strong-arm" act presenting novel and unusual feats bordering on the impossible.

**11 a. m. Armistice Hour**  
The American Legion asks that at this hour there shall be a cessation of all activities throughout the city for exactly two minutes in silent tribute to those who sacrificed their lives to our flag and for our country.  
Tape will be played by a special bugle corps of 25 pieces. Daylight fireworks will constitute an added feature to help commemorate this, the eleventh hour of the eleventh day, a date which will live for ever in the hearts of the American people.

**11:05 a. m. Annual Armistice Parade.**  
Parade forms at intersection of Main and Oakdale streets. Moves East on Main to Riverside, North on Riverside to Sixth street, West on Sixth street to Bartlett, South on Bartlett to Main and West on Main to Hotel Medford, giving those participating an opportunity of seeing the procession.  
Led by Alex. Sparrow, Marshal of the Day, the parade promises to be the greatest patriotic pageant in the history of Southern Oregon. Scores of attractive floats and decorated cars, unique comedy stunts and uniformed marching orders of every description will be in line. Musical music by two brass bands, the G. A. R. Pipe and Drum Corps and the Legion Drum Corps will stir the pulse and bring forth cheers for the veterans who offered their lives for our country.
