

### MERCHANTS WILL DECORATE CITY FOR CHRISTMAS

The Jackson County Merchants' association held their regular monthly meeting at the Medford hotel last night and among other things decided to decorate the main streets of the city with Christmas green and to give a window display early in December with a band concert and to invite everybody in Southern Oregon and Northern California to attend and to get the Christmas spirit early.

J. D. Russell gave a report of the adoption by the board of governors and advertisement committee of the Pacific Highway folder to be issued in the spring to attract tourist and settlers to the Pacific Northwest.

A committee was appointed to confer with the council committee to settle the question of double parking for a short time only, the proposed removal of jitney signs from the streets and giving all auto owners the same privilege to certain places on the streets that the jitneys now occupy.

Mr. DeClous of the Holland Hotel was made a member of the association.

H. C. Carle, the new Southern Pacific agent, was a visitor. It was announced at the meeting that the new budget for the city for 1926 provided funds for repaving the paving on West Main and other streets, where it is needed.

### Open Bids for Ashland Normal On Thursday

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 10.—Bids for the construction of the new Southern Oregon Normal school at Ashland will be opened at a meeting of the board of regents in Salem on Thursday of this week. It is thought the building will be completed by January 1, 1927. The cost will be about \$175,000, appropriated by the 1925 legislature.

### Radio News

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—(A. P.)—Committee of the fourth national radio conference went to work on the special problems assigned to their study with overcrowding in the broadcasting field, and the relations between broadcasters and music copy-righters—overhauling all other questions before the delegates.

The fine committee, named by Secretary Hoover at the opening session of the conference yesterday, are scheduled to make their preliminary reports after separate meetings, to a full meeting of the conference later in the day.

Another matter to which the delegates are giving their attention is a proposal by a number of radio experts that the lower wave lengths between 150 and 200 meters, now used by amateurs, be placed at the disposal of commercial broadcasting stations. Opposition to this has already developed among both amateur radio broadcasters, represented through the national amateur radio relay league by Hudson P. Maxim, Jr., its president, and many owners of amateur broadcasting stations who are against any new wave length allocations at least until the international radio conference next year.

The dispute between radio broadcasters and copyright owners, already has come sharply to the front in the conference sessions, with both sides asserting the will take their cases to congress during the coming session.

### ARMISTICE DAY AND RED CROSS KIWANIS TOPICS

The Kiwanis club meeting Monday was devoted principally to business and reports of work being done, especially the Red Cross drive now being conducted by the club in the downtown district which was progressing nicely.

Carl Gaddis reported on the meeting of the people with the county court, highway commission and citizens of Josephine county regarding the Skikyou super-road district and its endorsement by the highway commission. It's now up to the governor to call an election.

Supt. Hedrick complimented the high school football team and their coach, Callison, for their exceptionally clean playing and success and said the "dope" was that they would win Armistice Day, although they are not over-confident and are looking for a hard game. He also said they are endeavoring to secure a post-season game.

Carl Tengwald read a communication from national headquarters of the American Legion on the deep significance of Armistice Day and what it means to this nation, a portion of which follows:

"A holiday, to be entirely justified for national observance, must be more than a day of sports and general gaiety. Of course, we must not condemn the spirit of revelry, for it is a tone that heightens public morale and makes men more fit to attack the serious problems of life; we need only insist that other considerations of a more serious character be not ignored in our pursuit of amusement. It is especially proper that we rejoice on Armistice Day. We rejoice in victory, in the triumph of democracy over kaiserism, in the reestablishment of peace after a period of bloodshed and suffering without equal in the history of mankind."

"The public observance of a number of our holidays has made it apparent, however, that we must be watchful or these holidays will degenerate into occasions for mere purposeless pastime. We must not permit our revelry, justifiable though it be, to overshadow the deeper significance of Armistice Day. It must remain to be a day when we reflect upon the high ideals for which we entered the great conflict 'over there'; a day when we give thought to our comradeships in those days of long marches, box-car transportation, camp life, and army rations; a day when we hallow in memory those who made the supreme sacrifice and honor those whose fearless courage have been written into so many company records. It must be more a day when we take account of our progress toward the time to come when men shall settle their disputes across the council table and the 'show-down' shall succeed the sword; the era when peace will come to dominate over men's passions and war will be no more. It must also be a day however when we check up on our readiness to protect our homes and our national integrity against conspiracy and alien aggression, for men and nations have not yet entered the millennium of which we speak."

Armistice Day brought an end to the greatest conflict the world has ever known. We have heard the hope expressed that it might be the last of all great conflicts. The American Legion, constituted as it is, of men and women who know all too well the horrors of war, has consecrated itself in the preamble to its constitution to the promotion of peace and good will on earth. The American Legion seeks world peace—not a world peace founded on the dangerous principles of disarmament and submission, but a world peace founded on intelligent patriotism, international good will and understanding. Let us emphasize the reference to intelligent patriotism. This is not national bigotry, the boastful spirit which sees no good in other nations. Neither is it the weak-kneed patriotism, if we may really call it patriotism, which hables of peace at any price. Such a peace is not peace at all; it is trucking submission, dishonorable servility. The intelligent patriot is devoted to his nation's best and would gladly sacrifice his life to its welfare, but he also has sympathetic appreciation for the ideals and customs of other lands. The American Legion does not believe there is such a thing as a short cut to peace. The gradual good will, justice, and tolerance for others is the only sure way to our goal."

### STAGE DRIVERS NOT IN SYMPATHY WITH ATTACK ON GAS TAX

According to Mr. C. B. Howard, manager of the Howard & Grimes stage line and a member of the Oregon Motor Stage association, the organized stage operators of the state are not in sympathy with the attack on the gasoline tax made by W. L. Crawford in the United States courts in behalf of certain Oregon interests.

Mr. Crawford seeks to have the United States courts invalidate the law of Oregon providing for the present gasoline tax which is used for the construction and maintenance of the highways.

Mr. Howard states that the stage operators of this state, through the Oregon Motor Stage association, representing 95 per cent of the stage interests of Oregon, have several times gone on record publicly and officially, as being in favor of, not only the present gasoline tax, but an increase in this tax if additional funds are needed for construction and maintenance of our highways, their position being that the gasoline tax, together with a license fee, based on the weight of vehicles, is the fairest and most equitable measure of the use of and damage to the highways so far devised or suggested.
