UNIFICATION OF METHODIST CHURCH SEEMS PROBABLE

CHICAGO, Nov. 11.—(A. P.)—The Northern Methodist church has voted for unification with the Southern Methodists. The vote has been under way for months and passage by the constitutional majority necessary was announced today as 16,315 for and 811 against.

Southern Methodists are still voting with the result there still in doubt. Dr. R. M. Wade, secretary of the general conference of the Northern Episcopal church, who made the announcement, said that although the constitutional majority had been passed on the vote of 196 conferences, 49 conferences of his church had not yet officially reported their votes.

The statement in part follows: "If there should be a two-thirds majority in the Methodist Episcopal church south for unification, then the Methodist Episcopal church would call a general conference to meet with the general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church south, which meets in its regular session in May, 1926."

"The Methodist Episcopal church, according to the official vote has definitely decided for unification and it is assumed that the majority of votes will continue to be very large. Should a two-thirds majority be secured by the Methodist Episcopal church, south, and that is more probable at the present time than for some months past, the breach caused in 1845 would be healed and the two churches would eventually become one."

Unofficial tabulations of the southern church vote as made public Sunday in Nashville, Tenn., showed 2634 for unification and 2951 against it, the former being 878 votes short of a constitutional majority on the vote to date.
