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THE BEST ARMISTICE DAY SINCE THE WAR.

THIS is the best Armistice Day since the war. In a sense it is the first real one. For armistice means a temporary cessation of hostilities, but for seven years in Europe at least hostilities did not cease.

Today the prospect is completely changed. The signing of the Locarno Treaty, definitely marks the close of the war era in Central Europe.

For behind the technical agreement lies a changed public sentiment in all the European countries involved. The people of France, England and Germany have become convinced at last that peace is imperative, if mutual ruin is to be avoided.

Another cheering feature today is the constructive progress of the League of Nations, and increased sentiment in this country in favor of the World Court.

The halting of war between Greece and Bulgaria by action of the League, effectively disposes of the cynical contention that the League is powerless without the United States.

There was a will for war in Greece and a splendid opportunity for effective military action. But the League said no, told Greece what the consequences of aggression would be, and the militarists at Athens meekly retired.

So this is a great day for celebrating the Armistice, and the new Commander of the American Legion is quite justified in proclaiming a new era in the affairs of men.
