The mummy, however, was found to be adhering to the sarcophagus owing to the fluids poured over it in the ceremonies whereby the Pharaoh was dedicated as a god.

All those present at the removal of the sarcophagus from the tomb were greatly impressed with the richness and majesty of the art lavished upon it by the ancient artisans. Several days of extremely careful work will be required to detach the mummy safely from the adhering shell.

CAIRO, Egypt, Nov. 12.—(A. P.)—The inner coffin of Tut-Ankh-Amun's sarcophagus, containing the mummy, has been removed from the Pharaoh's tomb to that of Seti II, nearby, for examination.

### SECY. JARDINE FAVORS 58,844 MILES OF INTERSTATE ROADS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—(A. P.)—Secretary Jardine announced today his approval of the 58,844 miles of road designated by the joint board on interstate highways to make up the system to be known as United States highways.

The approved report of the board, composed of 24 state and federal highway officials, defines a network of 145 highway routes to compose the system, assigning to each a number, and includes designs for standard direction and warning signs to be erected on all routes.

In the route designations, those running east and west have even numbers and those north and south have odd numbers.

The danger and caution signs to be used will be of four different shapes representing as many degrees of danger, all having a yellow background with letters and symbols.

The group of signs will include the standard route markers in the form of a United States shield and direc-
