MEDFORD HI MAY PLAY OUTSIDERS ON THANKSGIVING

The Medford high school football team, following its 47 to 9 victory over Ashland Armistice Day, resumed practice Thursday evening in the rain, and went through hard scrimmage. The team plays Roseburg at Roseburg next Wednesday, and a week later, Thanksgiving, plays Ashland at Ashland, in the last game of the season.

As some of the squad plunged into the social whirl a week ago, Coach Callison announced "that cake-eaters could turn in their suits, and make room for better men."

Prospects for a post-season game with a Willamette valley, or a Portland school team are still in the formative period, but negotiations are under way to make financial arrangements with Ashland to call off the Thanksgiving game at Ashland and play an upstate team in this city instead, if one can be procured. This plan is agreeable to Coach Hughes of Ashland and the school authorities, with the exception of Professor Forsythe, who is now worried about "setting a bad precedent."

If no other arrangements can be made, the second and third squad will fulfill the Ashland engagement, and the 15 members of the first string play the outside team. This would forestall "setting a bad precedent," but probably be a severe financial jolt to the sister city which the local authorities desire to avoid if possible.

It is expected that definite news on the game will be forthcoming by the first of the week.

YALE A 2 TO ONE FAVORITE OVER PRINCETON TIGERS

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—(A. P.) Odds have lengthened on most of the favorites in this Saturday's football battles.

Yale rules a two to one choice over Princeton, with a wager of \$2000, to \$1000, the largest reported on the basis of these odds, which have lengthened from eight to five.

Other wagers today established Army an overwhelming favorite over Columbia at 1 1/2 to 1, with Pennsylvania, Dartmouth and Brown each quoted at odds of nine to five over Pittsburg, Chicago and Harvard, respectively. Colgate is a six to five choice over Syracuse.

Wagers on the outcome of the Army-Navy classic here November 28 also have witnessed an increase of odds on the Army from 2 to 1 to 2 1/2 to 1.

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—(A. P.) Five great struggles between individuals who have attained fame on eastern football fields will draw the cheers of thousands this Saturday. Swede Oberlander, Dartmouth's backfield marvel, who two years ago played as a line-man, meets an exceptional foe in "Five Yards" McCarty of Chicago, a plunger who has gained his nickname through vicious attacks on opposing lines. Oberlander undoubtedly is adept in more departments of the game than McCarty, but the mighty Chicagoan may break through at any time and is always good for the last five yards to a touchdown.

At Syracuse there is another great individual performance in the making with Eddie Tryon, little halfback who conquered Princeton, playing for Colgate against Harlan Carr of Syracuse. They are of the running type, open field workers par excellence—dodging, twisting wiles to whom long runs around the ends and through the tackles are comparatively common.

CALIFORNIA HAS SLIGHT EDGE IN HUSKY CONTEST

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 13.—(A. P.)—The peak of the football season on the Pacific coast tomorrow brings together Washington and Berkeley in a colorful game which may determine the 1925 championship. Neither team has been defeated in coast conference action this year. In addition, California is winding up its sixth season of no defeats by a college eleven. Around 75,000 persons are expected to witness the game. A win by Washington is expected to virtually clinch the title for the northern eleven. It has only to defeat Oregon, a team which has lost all of its conference games this season.

Should California win, it still has to settle Stanford's claims a week later in the annual "big game," and a win by the Cardinals would throw the title into the air, with three and possibly four teams tied.

Although the teams compare favorably in strength, California was a slight favorite today to take the measure of the Huskies.

Oregon and the Oregon Aggies will battle for home honors at Eugene in a contest marked by traditional rivalry. It will have conference bearing as will the game at Los Angeles, where Southern California entertains Montana.

Stanford has an easier assignment and will meet California, southern branch, at Palo Alto.
