FRANCE TO TRY FLIGHT TO POLE

PARIS, Nov. 17.—(A. P.)—The French navy department plans an expedition to the north pole next spring and a subsequent airplane flight from the pole to New York City, it was announced today.

Supplied and manned by the navy department and equipped with scientific apparatus, the expedition will be known as the "French air mission to the north pole."

The expedition will leave Dunkirk, France, about the end of April, establish a base at Spitzbergen, the Norwegian archipelago, and then strike off for the pole, carrying seaplanes on specially devised auto sledges capable of traveling either on water or ice.

Upon the arrival at the pole, the plans provide, the members of the expedition will take off by air for New York.
