JEFFERSON HIGH IS INVITED TO PLAY MEDFORD

Invitations have been extended by the Medford high school to the Jefferson high school of Portland, and the winner of the game next Saturday between Corvallis and Salem, for a post-season football game in this city. In the opinion of local fans, acceptance is highly probable from Salem or Jefferson, and not so sure from Corvallis, who in the past has shied from the prospect. If defiance overcomes this trio of prospective claimants of the state high school championship, the University of Oregon Freshmen will be invited. If they are unable to be present, one of the two California high schools who have expressed a willingness to come to southern Oregon, will be selected.

The Medford team left this morning for Roseburg, where they will play Roseburg high today at the dedication of their new athletic field. Ashland plays Grants Pass this afternoon. The Josephine county team is the favorite to win, but Ashland in their first game played them a tie.

The local squad has been taking it easy all week. When they return from Roseburg they will get down to business for the Thanksgiving day game with Ashland. Conrad's bum hoof is now well, and he will be back in the Ashland game. The Ashland team has high hopes of taking some of the sting out of the Armistice day slaughter, at the final meeting. The entire Medford first string will go into action in an effort to exceed the score of their first victory.

O. A. C. COACH AFRAID OF VANDAL GAME

CORVALLIS, Ore., Nov. 18.—Though comparative scores for the season indicate that the Oregon Aggies should win the football game from Idaho at Boise Saturday, Coach Schlander said he was none too sure of the game because of the physical and mental slump which he said always follows winning the big traditional game of the season.

In light signal practice last night the team showed none too well. Gonzaga, Oregon and Montana have each been met this season by both the Aggies and the Vandals. Against each of these O. A. C. showed superiority at winning over Gonzaga and Montana by 22-0 and 27-7 scores, while these latter defeated Idaho 12-3 and 20-14. Idaho defeated Oregon 6-0 in the first conference game of the season, while the Aggies last Saturday won from the Webfooters 24-13.

IDAHO TO BE READY FOR AGGIES SATURDAY

MOSCOW, Idaho, Nov. 18.—Still limping as a result of recent setbacks, the University of Idaho football team is priming for its last conference game of the season against the Oregon Aggies at Boise next Saturday. The game will be the eighth between the two teams. O. A. C. won the first five contests and Idaho captured those in 1923 and 1924. The Vandals expect to be in good condition for the Oregon eleven, a week of rest adding greatly to their strength.

SNOW TOO DEEP DARTMOUTH SAYS TO PLAY HUSKIES

SEATTLE, Nov. 18.—(A.P.)—Seattle alumni of Dartmouth university which has been under consideration with the University of Washington for football game in the rose bowl at Pasadena, Calif., New Year's day, were informed today that their alma mater would not consider such a proposal.

It was explained that the snow is so deep around Hanover, N. H., the seat of Dartmouth, that those in charge of athletics there feel that enough practice to do the institution justice in a post-season intercollegiate game could not be obtained. The Pacific coast intercollegiate conference, which is in charge of an east-west game in the rose bowl New Year's day, has invited no teams, it was stated here. The matter is in the hands of Jack Benefiel, graduate manager at the University of Oregon, acting for the conference.

Listed as next in line for consideration after Dartmouth to represent the east were the Universities of Illinois and Alabama and Colgate and Syracuse in the west.

The Huskies are expected to receive an invitation to represent the west in the rose bowl if they defeat the College of Puget Sound in Tacoma Tuesday and the University of Oregon here Thanksgiving day.

RED GRANGE HAS GAINED 2 MILES AND SCORED 186

CHICAGO, Nov. 18.—(A.P.)—"Red" Grange, whose collegiate football career ends in the Illinois-Ohio State game Saturday, has gained two miles in yardage and made 31 touchdowns in nineteen games.

Statistically inclined experts have compiled the numerical record of his achievements, which they think set a record for all time.

During the three years in which "Red's" jersey with its bright "77" has gone flashing through opposing tacklers, the Wheaton ice man has been unable to score only four times, three of those came this year, in the games of Nebraska, Michigan and Chicago. Nebraska had the honor in 1924.

Against Michigan in 1924 Grange reached his greatest heights, when he returned the opening kick-off 95 yards for a touchdown and added four more touchdowns. He gained 402 yards in this game.

In three years he gained a total of almost two miles—3402 yards. The greatest amount of it, 569 yards, is charged to Iowa. The least, 56, to Minnesota. He made 32 completed forward passes for a total of 601 yards, an average of 18 yards each. Seven of these passes were against Chicago and totaled 177 yards or an average of more than 21 yards each.

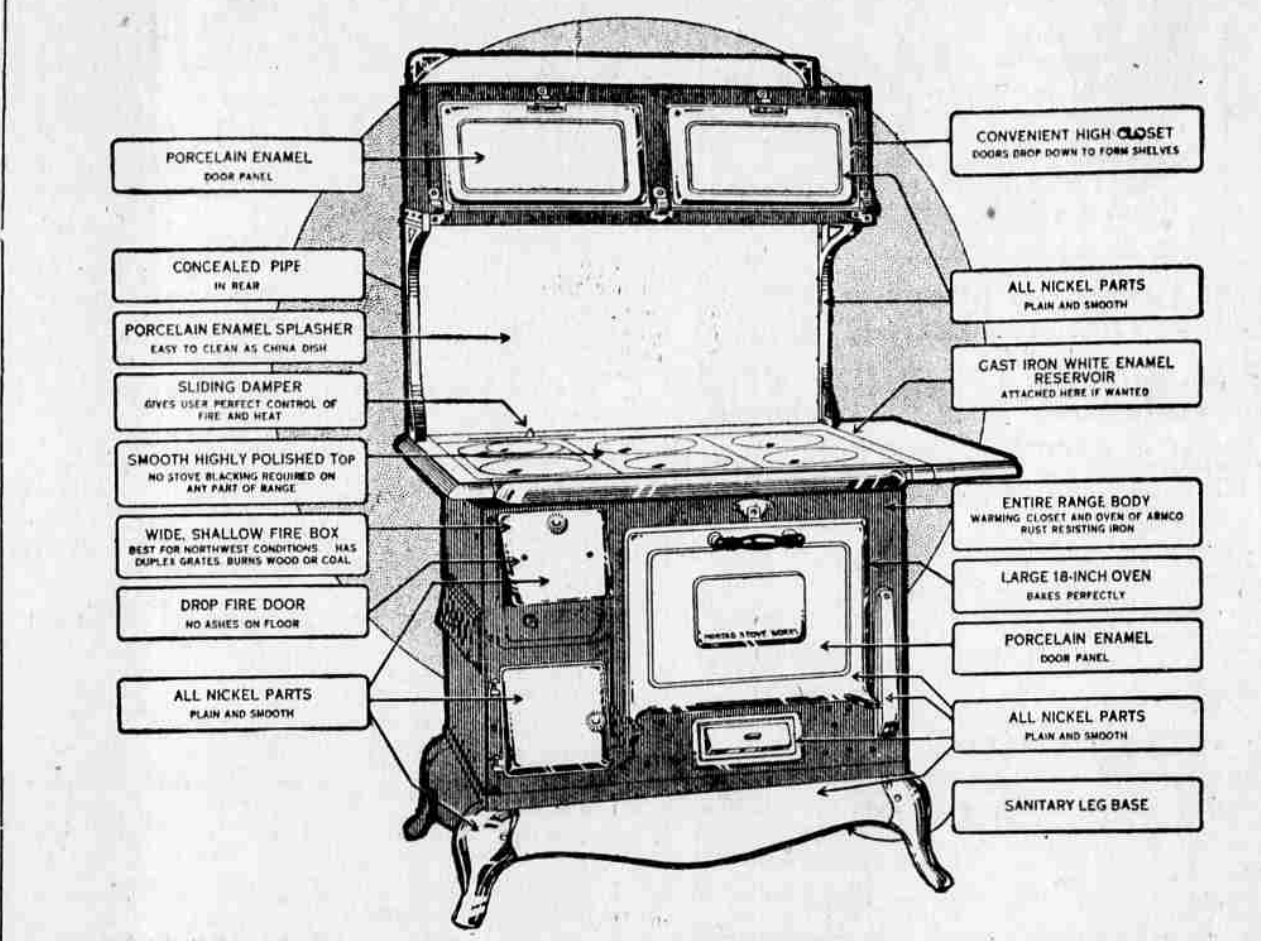
