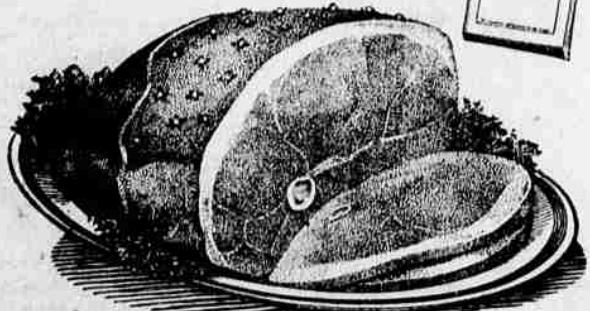

The Sperry Master Recipe

POUND CAKE—bread pan size

1 cup butter
1 1/2 cups sugar
2 cups Sperry Drifted Snow Flour
5 eggs
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon each lemon and vanilla extract

Cream butter alone till it can be beaten with a spoon, then add sugar gradually, beating mixture until creamy. Separate eggs; beat yolks until thick, and whites until stiff. Add beaten yolks to the creamed butter and sugar; mix well, then add portion of the flour. Stir (do not beat) until smooth, then fold in a portion of the stiffly beaten egg whites. Continue to fold in flour and egg whites alternately, add flavoring, and pour into an ungreased paper lined pan. Bake in a very moderate oven (325° F.) one hour for square or round cake and longer if a deep bread pan is used. Cool thoroughly before cutting. Keeps moist and fresh two weeks at least.

NOTE: All measurements are level, flour is sifted once before measuring. Use half pint measuring cup.

White Fruit Cake

With elder or coffee, how it will delight your guests! Prepare the Master Recipe and add the following ingredients, lightly floured, after the cake is mixed: 1/2 cup finely shredded citron; 1 cup bleached Sultan raisins; 1/2 cup shredded blanched almonds. Bake as for Pound Cake, the Master Recipe.

Spice Cup Cakes

Such tempting little cakes—youngsters never get enough! Prepare the Master Recipe. When sifting flour add 1 teaspoon each of nutmeg and cinnamon and 1/2 teaspoon each cloves and allspice. Fill ungreased muffin pans half full of mixture and bake in a slow oven (325° F.) for about 45 minutes. A cupful of raisins, nuts or shredded citron may be added.

RUM CHASER HAD NARROW ESCAPE IN RECENT GALE

ASTORIA, Ore., Nov. 19.—(A.P.)—Shipwrecked, buffeted for two days on the Pacific without power or steering means, storm swept by the big blow of Saturday which caught them in a ninety mile gale, the fifteen men, in command of Ensign M. A. Ransom, U. S. N., detailed with the rum chaser R. C. Smith to prohibition duties in Pacific waters, were brought into port here today with what was left of the vessel in tow of the coast guard cutter Snohomish.

Their forward decks had been cleared of equipment, ventilators and deck housing had been torn away. The vessel was partly filled with water. A survey here will be required to ascertain other damage.
The R. C. Smith, en route from Ketchikan, Alaska, to San Francisco, touched at Astoria Friday afternoon and put to sea again just in time to be caught in the heavy gale off Cape Blanco Saturday night. The wind reached a velocity of 90 miles said Commander Ransom. It took away the ventilators and everything on the decks and in a few minutes the water washing into the boat had filled her to such an extent that the engines were put out of commission. Then the boat without power or steering means was at the mercy of the terrific gale. Men worked heroically to keep out the great seas. They drifted thus through the storm and all day Sunday and part of Monday before they were picked up by the steam schooner Cello and taken in tow.

The seas were still high and what little was left on the decks was ripped away by the swishing low line. They proceeded northward and Tuesday the Cello turned the wreck over to the Snohomish. Lieutenant Commander Roemer brought her into port today.

JARDINE GIVES OFFICIAL O. K. TO ROAD SYSTEM

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—(A.P.)—Secretary Jardine today announced his approval of a national system of roads selected by the joint board on inter-state highways to be known as United States highways.

The road system includes 75,884 miles of highway, each route of which has been designated by number, and the secretary's approval of the joint board's plan has been forwarded to the American Association of State Highway Officials, meeting in Detroit this week.

The secretary's approval of the board's highway plan brings to a close work of the 24 state and national highway officials appointed last March by Secretary Gore to draft a highway plan. The board's report provides for the marking of the selected highways with standard direction and warning signs.

In a letter to Thomas H. MacDonald, chairman of the joint board, Secretary Jardine declared the adoption of the board's proposals, will "accomplish a marked advance in the highway system and building program of the country as a whole."

"The clear designation of important routes of travel," he said, "will be a distinct advantage not only in eliminating confusion, but also in furthering systematic and continuous construction."

YUMA, Arizona, Nov. 18.—William Schroeder, 58, miner and prospector of Redding, Cal., died in a local hospital after being picked up by two desert travelers. Schroeder became separated from a companion during a sand storm and spent six days and nights on the desert without food or water.

Acquitted of Murder.

BAKER, Ore., Nov. 18.—(A. P.)—After deliberating but 15 minutes a circuit court jury here today found David Arthur not guilty of manslaughter in connection with the fatal stabbing of G. C. Tucker at the Mother Lode mine. The stabbing occurred September 1. Self-defense was the plea of Arthur.
