### MINNESOTA HAS BEST CHANCE TO WIN CONFERENCE

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—(A. P.)—Scrimmage ends today in the western conference which awaits the week-end when the football title ple may all go to Minnesota, the only undefeated "big ten" team to date, or be divided among Minnesota, Michigan and Northwestern, as teams defeated only once each.

Michigan, with only a field goal scored against it during the season, expects to depend on its forward passing to beat Minnesota at Ann Arbor. Benny Friedman, its quarterback is doing the biggest share of the tossing.

The storm centering about Harold "Red" Grange, Illinois captain and his probable future after he ends his collegiate career against Ohio Saturday, is having an effect on Illinois morale. Grange has been absent from practice for two days, while conferring with his father regarding his acceptance of offers to play professional football, enter the movies, sell real estate or write for newspapers.

The Buckeyes see a chance to end their season of mediocre success by defeating Grange and his mates. Chicago is grooming substitutes to supplant the regulars scholastically ineligible for the Wisconsin tilt.

Notre Dame has three backfield combinations ready for Northwestern it being Coach Rockne's plan to use his shock troops in relay against the Purple. Northwestern, ending its most successful season in a quarter century, has its regular lineup ready to start, except Fisher.

### RICKARD NAMES FISTIC LEADERS FOR BIG TOURNEY

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—(A. P.)—Champions in every fistic division are given three contenders from which to pick an opponent for a title bout under Tex Rickard's direction.

The promoter, making public this list of contenders today, expects it to furnish a basis for championship frays in most of the divisions of the ring of the New Madison Square Garden.

But in the heavyweight and middleweight ranks, the money demands of Jack Dempsey and Harry Greb must recede before they can be considered for anything but bouts in the larger outdoor arenas.

Rickard lists Harry Wills and Gene Tunney as the foremost American contenders for Dempsey's title, but creates a surprise in the choice of Paulino Uzcuduz, Spanish heavyweight, for the third entry.

In the light-heavyweight class, now ruled by Paul Berlenbach, Rickard has placed Jack Delaney, Bridgeport, Conn., as the ranking contender, and, next to Delaney, Mike McTigue and Young Stribling.

Rickard accords Babe Shrade the distinction of being foremost contender in both the middleweight class against Harry Greb and the welterweight division against Mickey Walker. Frank Moody and Jimmy Slattery are selected as Greb's other outstanding foes, while Walker's other main rivals are considered to be Tommy Milligan, European champion and Benny Leonard, retired lightweight king, who hopes to return to the ring.

In the lightweight division in which Jimmy Goodrich is king, Rickard has named Sammy Mandel, Sid Terris and Louis Vicentini.

The featherweight champion, Louis (Kid) Kaplan of Meriden, Conn., who meets his outstanding challenger, Babe Herman, in the second attraction in the New Madison Square Garden, December 18, will likely not be asked to fight again, but Rickard has named Johnny Dundee and Danny Kramer, as other outstanding rivals.

Mickey Garcia (Dushey Graham), Abe Goldstein and Joe Lazarus are selected by Rickard as the logical contenders in the bantamweight division, now ruled by Charlie (Phil) Rosenberg.

Rickard figures that Fidel LaBarba of Los Angeles, has the outstanding claim to the flyweight title. He also names "Newsboy" Brown, Frankie Genaro and Ernie Jarvis as outstanding 112-pounders.

### JEFFERSON HIGH TO PLAY WAITE

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 19.—(A. P.)—Waite high school of Toledo, Ohio, may play Jefferson high school of Portland if the Toledo team captures the football championship of Toledo. A letter from the Waite team to Hopkin Jenkins, principal of Jefferson high school, received today, expressed willingness to meet Jefferson if the latter team captured the Portland championship and Waite annexed the Toledo title. Jefferson, by defeating Lincoln high here yesterday, won the Portland honor. At the time of writing the letter the Toledo team had one more game on its schedule.

### BROCCOLI FAILURE CAUSES SUICIDE

ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 19.—Howard L. Ward, a resident of the Green station community, was found dead at his home late last night, having committed suicide by shooting himself in the head early in the day. His act apparently having been caused by despondency over ill health and financial reverses.

Mr. Ward had been in poor health for the past two or three months. He had been operating a small farm near Green and had suffered the loss of his broccoli crop, so that his financial condition was causing him considerable worry. Unable to work, he became very despondent, and it is believed that this condition led up to his taking his own life.
